Iractors, farm equipment stolen in three counties

The Goodland Star-News Farmers, be sure to lock your tractors up at night. And be on the lookout for any unusual equipment on the loose.

Tractors and other farm equipment have been stolen from three Kansas counties, and sheriff's departments in at least five counties have been involved in the search for them. Two tractors from Wichita County (Leoti) were recovered in Hutchinson and in Ness County, but now the Wichita County sheriff's department is looking for two more, plus a planter and a seed hopper.

And the Lane County (Dighton) sheriff is looking for a tractor stolen from the southwest part of the county in January.

The Rush County (La Crosse) sheriff has recovered a dump truck stolen from the county's landfill in December and a pickup and tractor stolen from SemGas Gathering in January and has three suspects in jail on theft, burglary and criminal damage charges.

A 2000 John Deere 8210 front-

100-gallon tank attached and a 2005 black car trailer were reported stolen last week in Wichita County.
