# Grant Junior High finishes fourth at home

Both of Grant Junior High's eighth-grade track and field teams finished fourth at the Goodland Invitational Saturday while the seventh-grade boys finished fifth and the girls seventh.

Colton Nelson led the eighth-grade Mustangs by winning both the shot put and the discus. He put the shot at 38 feet, 11.5 inches and threw the discus 130 feet, 7 inches. Jay Cotter was second in the shot put at 38 feet, 8 inches.

Harrison Ford finished sixth at 35 feet, 5.75 inches.

Nelson also ran the 1,600-meter run in 5 minutes, 44.75 seconds placing fourth.

Ben Waugh leaped 16 feet, 7 inches in the long jump to place second. He also cleared 4 feet, 10 inches to tie for sixth in the high jump and was sixth in the 200-meter dash running it in 27.43 seconds.

Kuter Isaac was fourth in the 800-meter run finishing it in 2:33.57.

In the relay events, the eighth-grade Mustangs were fourth in the 4x200 and fifth in both the 4x100 and 4x400.

Scott City won the eighth-grade boys team competition with

Burlington second and Colby third. Kamisha Nonamaker led the way for the eighth-grade Lady Mustangs by winning the 1,600-meter run in 6:28.47.

Angie Medrano finished third in the same event in 6:52.13. In the 800-meter run, Medrano finished third and Nonamaker fourth. Their times were not available.

Rosa Sandoval ran the 100-meter hurdles in 19.34 seconds for third place and Jessi Geist ran the 100-meter dash in 14.21 finishing sixth. Alexis Bateman reached 12 feet, 8.5 inches to place second in the long jump and Katie Clancy cleared 3

feet, 10 inches in the high jump for sixth place.

Kala Sharp finished fourth in the shot put at 28 feet, 4.5 inches.

Grant's eighth-grade girls won the 4x200-meter relay in 2:04.7, and were fourth in the 4x100 and sixth in the 4x400.

Colby won the eighth-grade girls title with Scott City second and Wallace County third.

David Murray heaved the shot put 31 feet, 5 inches finishing second among seventh-grade boys while teammate Tyler Jones reached 27 feet, 10 inches for fifth. Sixth-place finishers for the sev-

enth-grade Mustangs were Nathan Deeds in the 100-meter dash and the long jump; Brock Wilkens in the 100-meter hurdles and high jump; Dillon Trachsel in the 400-meter dash; Michael Pettibone in the 1,600-meter run; and Devon Garret in the discus.

Grant's seventh-grade boys were fourth in the 4x100, 4x200 and 4x400-meter relays.

Kirsten Topliff tied for second in the seventh-grade girls shot put with a heave of 26 feet, 8 inches. Andrea Roeder was fourth at 26 feet, 6.25 inches and Jade Herl was fifth at 26 feet, 2.75 inches.

Roeder placed third in the discus with a throw of 56 feet, 4.25 inches and Kaitlyn Lammers was fifth at 54 feet, 4 inches.

Ashley Archer finished sixth in the long jump.

The seventh-grade girls placed third in both the 4x100 and 4x200-meter relays, and were fifth in the 4x400.

Scott City won the seventh-grade boys team title with Colby second. In the girls competition it was Colby first and Scott City second. Burlington was third for both boys and girls.

## Ten-year-old places third at invitational

The grandson of a Goodland couple placed third at the Huskerland State Invitational Wrestling Tournament.

Quinten Dawes, 10, is the son of Derek and Lisa Dawes of Gretna, Neb. Don and Phyllis Dawes are his grandparents. Dawes, who wrestles for the Gretna Dragons, was the only one to qualify for

state. His wrestling record was 34-7 in the 65-pound weight class.

He is in the gifted program at his school. His dad is the plant manager for Kerry Foods and his mom is a registered nurse.

Dawes has been wrestling in the Nebraska Kids Wrestling program for three years.

## Brewster junior plays with volleyball club

Although Brewster High School junior Dani Bedore could not play varsity volleyball for the Lady Bulldogs last fall, she is keeping her skills sharp by playing with the Colorado Juniors Volleyball Club.

The club consists of six teams of girls 13 to 18 that compete in tournaments across the nation.

Earlier this month, Bedore's team, the "17s," won the Rocky Mountain Regional Tournament in Denver, winning all six of its matches.

There are 10 players on the "17s" roster, most of them from

the Colorado Springs area. Seven already have committed to play college ball in fall 2007, with six, including Bedore, heading to NCAA Division I schools.

Bedore is planning to join the Lady Gamecocks of the University of South Carolina, in the Southeastern Conference. Her older brother Jordan plays football for Kansas State University, also an NCAA Division I school.

The "17s" are back in action today for the start of the three-day Far Western Tournament at the Sparks Convention Center in Reno, Nev. The team also has a tournament in Chicago in June.

Last month, the team won the Colorado Crossroads Junior National Qualifier tournament in Denver, earning a trip to the National Junior Olympic Tournament in Atlanta in July. Thirty-one teams competed in the Crossroads' 17-year-old bracket, with the top three earning a trip to the national tournament.

Dani is the daughter of Dustin and Barb Bedore of Brewster and the granddaughter of Waldo and Glenna Jarmin of Edson. She spent her freshman and sophomore years at Goodland High, where she lettered in volleyball, basketball and track. Dani made

the All-Northwest Kansas League volleyball and basketball teams in both her years as a Cowgirl.

The Kansas State High School Activities Association determined at the beginning of the school year the move the Bedore family made last summer from Goodland to Brewster did not meet the criteria set in Rule 18 of the association's handbook.

That decision caused Bedore to sit out the entire volleyball season as a varsity player and the first six games of the Lady Bulldogs' basketball season.
