

Three place third at Holcomb

The Cowgirls track and field team finished 10th and the Cowboys 11th at last Friday's Holcomb High School Invitational.

Junior Kaylee Billinger placed third in the 400-meter dash in 1 minute, 3.36 seconds and sixth in the high jump, clearing 4 feet, 8 inches. She ran the anchor leg in both the 4x100 and 4x400-meter relays.

Senior Lisha Tedford placed third in the shot put with a heave of 32 feet, 4.25 inches. She also competed in the discus with her best throw reaching 86 feet, 6.5 inches.

Freshman Michelle Smith placed third in the discus and fourth in the shot put in 97 feet, 6 inches and 31 feet, 8 inches respectively.

Junior Emily Murray placed fifth in the 100-meter high hurdles in 17.34 seconds. She ran the 300-

meter hurdles in 52.17. Murray also ran a leg in both relay events.

Junior Stephanie Sheldon cleared 8 feet to place fifth in the pole vault and also ran in both relays.

Other Cowgirls in Holcomb were seniors Kali Rietcheck and Tiffany Thomas, junior Whitney Dautel and freshman Taylor McLemore.

Rietcheck competed in both the 400-meter dash and the high jump, and ran a leg in the 4x400-meter relay.

Thomas and Dautel both ran the 800- and 1,600-meter runs, with Dautel in the 3,200. McLemore competed in the 100- and 200-meter dashes, and ran a leg of the 4x100 relay.

The Lady Eagles of Colby won the team competition by taking six of 18 events. Senior Jessica Stephens was a double winner, tak-

ing the gold in both the 1,600- and 3,200-meter runs.

The Cowboys were led by junior Kerek Mason, who placed fourth in the 1,600-meters in 4:43.79.

Mason was fifth in both the 800- and 3,200-meter runs, finishing in 2:06.67 and 11.33.56. He also ran the 100-meter dash.

Senior Cory Yarbrough cleared 5 feet, 10 inches to place fifth in the high jump, and also did the long jump and ran the 200-meter dash.

Freshman Bob Doxon place fifth in both the shot put and discus, reaching 41 feet, 1 inch and 121 feet, .75 inch respectively.

Other Cowboys at the meet were juniors Troy Harrison and Nathan Thomas, and sophomore Casey Henderson. Harrison ran the 400-meter dash and did the triple and long jumps.

Thomas threw the discus. Henderson ran both the 100 and 200-meter dashes and did the shot put.

The Hugoton Eagles won the boys title.

The Tri-State Relays begin at 2 p.m. today at the high school track east of the Northwest Kansas Technical College administration building.

Junior Emily Murray finished fourth in the 100-meter high hurdles running it in 17.34 seconds at last Friday's Holcomb Invitational. Murray also competed in the 300-meter hurdles and ran legs in the Cowgirls 4x100 and 4x400-meter relays.

Five Cowboy golfers were among the top 10 finishers at Monday's Goodland Junior Varsity Invitational held on the front nine at Sugar Hills Golf Club.

Freshman Drew Raile won the tournament with an 11-over-par 46.

Freshman Andrew Taylor placed third with a 48.

Freshman Joel Weis and sopho-

more Andrew Miller both shot a 53 to finish sixth and seventh. Sophomore Jason Krayca shot a 55 for ninth place.

"It was great to see Drew win it," said Coach Jon McLean, "have several of our other kids place. I was proud of the kids for the way they played on such a miserable day."

It was a cold, rainy day with a

strong wind out of the north which had gusts up to 48 miles per hour.

Other Cowboys competing in the tournament were junior John Mosbarger; sophomores Chris Irvin and Jon McClung; and freshmen Jace Mosbarger, Nelson Bergeman, and Talen Martin. Irvin and Jace Mosbarger shot 63, Bergeman and John Mosbarger

shot 67, Martin 71 and McClung a 73.

Forty-six golfers, including several girls, from eight schools played Monday. The junior varsity will be back on the links today at the Oakley Country Club. Tee off will be around 2 p.m. (Mountain Time).

Lady Trojans win home doubleheaders

The Colby Community College softball team swept its home doubleheader Wednesday against Garden City winning the opener 10-1 in five innings and the second game 1-0.

Sophomores Jere Ebert and Lindsey Marsh both went three-for-three at the plate in the first game scoring two runs each. Ebert's twin sister Heather, also a sophomore, hit

a grand slam. Sophomore Amanda Bell pitched all five innings, striking out six, for her 25th win of the season.

Heather Ebert led the Lady Trojans at the plate in the second game going two-for-three and driving in a run. Jere Ebert gave up just two hits in seven innings on the mound to earn her 13th win.

"We found a way to push one run

across the plate and our defense played well enough to secure the win," said Coach Carl Adams.

The Trojans got back on the winning track after losing all three of their games last Saturday during the Allen Wolf Memorial Tournament in Colby. The team lost to Garden City 6-1, Western Nebraska Community College 3-2 and to Lamar Community College (Colo.) 4-0.

The Lady Trojans, now 38-19, play a home doubleheader Saturday against Butler County and another on Sunday against Otero Junior College (Colo.).

Saturday's doubleheader will determine the West Division champion of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference, Coach Adams said. If Colby win both games, the Trojans are the champions. If not, the Lady Grizzlies will take the title.

Colby will be the host for the National Junior College Athletic Association Region VI tournament next week.
