Tri-State Relays off the mark despite weather

The Goodland Star-News For the first time in three years, Goodland's Tri-State Relays were held on schedule Friday in spite of cool weather and a light drizzle.

The Cowgirls won four events, with junior Emily Murray taking both the 100-and 300-meter hurdles in 17.01 and 55.29 seconds. Murray place second in the long jump at 14 feet, 3.5 inches.

Senior Lisha Tedford won the shot put with a toss of 32 feet, 9 inches. Freshman Michelle Smith placed fourth in the shot at 30 feet, 7 inches. Smith threw the discus 100 feet, 5 inches for third place.

Junior Stephanie Sheldon cleared 9 feet to win the pole vault. Sophomore Amanda Amthor cleared 6 feet, 6 inches for fifth place.

Other Cowgirls placing among the top five Friday included junior Kaylee Billinger, who ran the 100meter dash in 12.58 seconds and the 400-meter dash in 1 minute, 4.49 seconds, finishing second in both events. She also cleared 4 feet. 8

Doxon won the shot put with a heave of 43 feet, 9 inches. He placed second in the discus with a throw of 126 feet. 11 inches.

Sophomore Casey Henderson placed second in both the 100- and 200-meter dashes in 11.43 and 23.85 seconds. He was fifth in the shot put at 39 feet, 5.25 inches.

Other Cowboys among the top five in their events were freshman Zach Lohr, who cleared 5 feet, 4 inches in the high jump for third, and sophomore Grant Wilkens, who cleared 9 feet, 6 inches in the pole vault for fifth.
