Tyghé Nielsen, 29, a Goodland native, will be graduating from the University of Kansas School of Medicine this month.

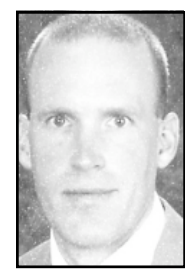
