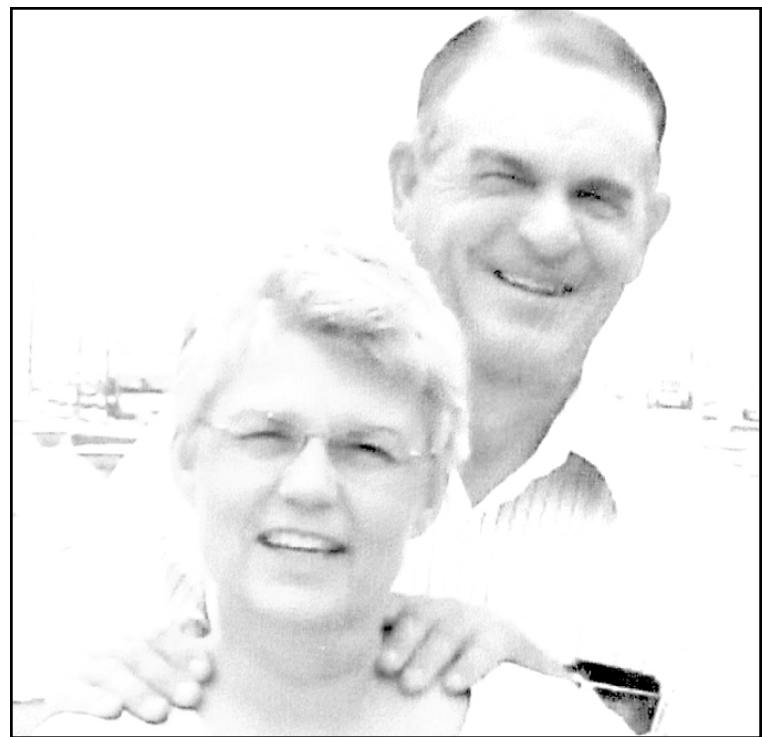

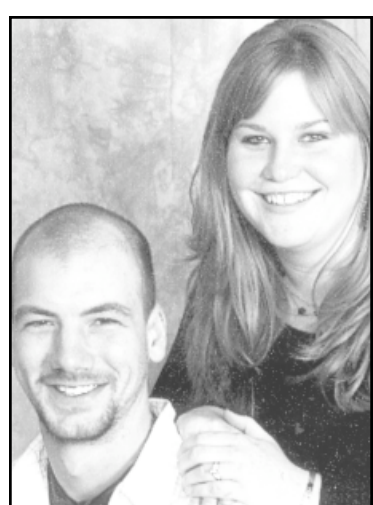
Kate Workman and Drew Wurtz, both of Goodland, have announced their engagement.
