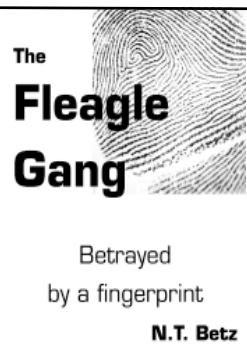

## Nefarious Kansas criminals

### Fingerprint ends nationwide '20s manhunt



#### 'Betrayed by a Fingerprint' — A definite Must Read

In addition to the fascinating look into the actions of four criminals and the courts of the late 1920's, this story marks several landmarks in forensics and law enforcement techniques — including the first time a single fingerprint was used to identify and convict a criminal and the first transportation of a suspect by airplane. A must read for history and true crime buffs alike!

"The Fleagle Gang" details the robbery/murder case which hinged on a single fingerprint — precursor to today's *CSI* shows — found on a murdered Dighton, Kan., doctor's car. The fledgling FBI plays a crucial role in turning the fingerprint into solid forensic evidence used to find, arrest and convict members of the Fleagle Gang. The FBI credits the Fleagle case as the first time a single fingerprint was used to identify and convict criminals.

The Fleagle Gang robbed banks in Larned, Kinsley, Marysville, Ottawa and McPherson Kan., Lamar, Colo., Eugene, Ore., and countless others of over \$1 million in the 10 years they operated.
