They will celebrate the anniversary with a private party and vow renewal performed by Chaplain Tysen at their home in rural Lincoln County Saturday, June 17.

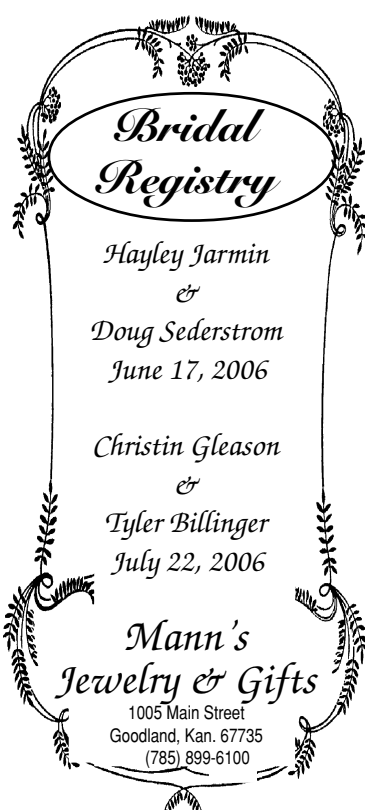
