we get to use it for something?"

Rasure asked Bruce Gleason, ambulance service director, who was at the meeting, what he thought.

"I think it is a good idea," Gleason said. "After the snow storm last year, we had trouble getting people to the hospital. We need something like that truck.

"Years ago we had an old Army six-by, and with the eight-wheel drive, it was the only way to get around."

"It is a good idea if we can figure out how to pay for it," Tiede said. Rasure said he thought the money

may have to come out of the sheriff's budget.

Butts said he would find out what it would take to have Polkinghorn put one together for Sherman County. A winch would be an add-on and cost \$2,000

"What are you going to winch onto?" Tiede asked. "There are not a lot of trees out here."

Butts said Polkinghorn told him a lot of people don't get the winch, but come back later and have it put on.

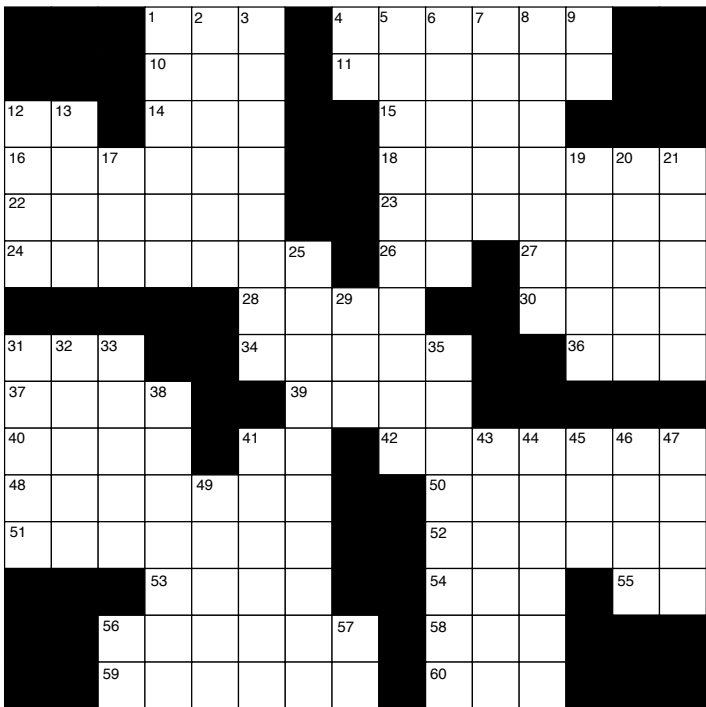
