McKee shot an 11-over-par 83, just two strokes behind state champion Zack Rockey of Udall. McKee, Rockey and Ben Murphy of Coldwater's South Central High played in the same group. Murphy shot a 90 finishing to finish in a fiveway tie for 15th.

McKee's group was the last of 30 to tee off. After an hour delay due to weather, the group got in only three holes before lightning forced another delay.

Brewster coach Rae Stewart said it was about 9 p.m. when the last group teed off for hole 18. Because of darkness, a tournament official had to stand by the cup so the golfers could see where it was. Spotters helped players find their balls on the fairway. Award ceremony was held by flashlight 13 hours after tee off.
