A Goodland preschool has become the second in the town and fifth in northwest Kansas to receive accreditation from the National Association for the Education of Young Children.

Judi Vignery, director of Judi's Rainbow Preschool, 711 Arcade, received word of the accreditation last month. The West Elementary preschool received its accreditation in May 2004.

The process involved a self-study and program improvement and a visit by an accreditation validator. Judi's Rainbow Preschool started

the effort in May of 2001 with money and support from Smart Start Northwest Kansas in Colby.

The validation examines the interactions between teachers and children, the curriculum, physical environment, health and safety, relationships among teachers and families and staff qualifications and development.

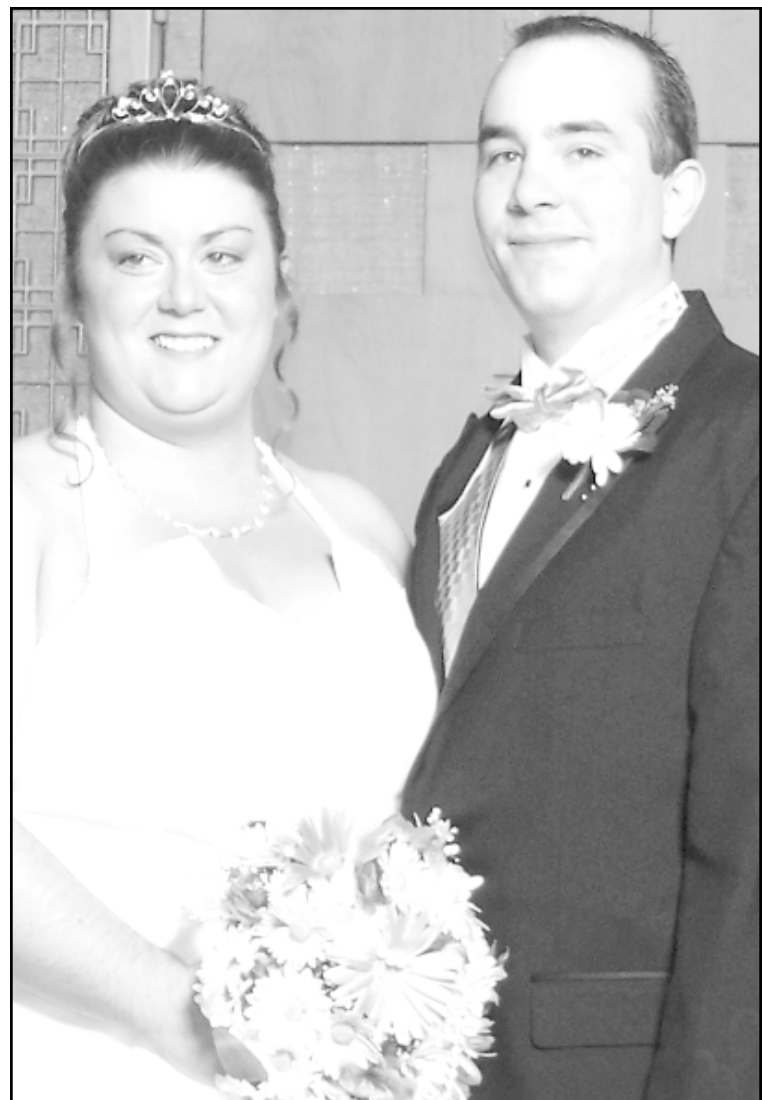
Becoming accredited says the preschool is meeting high quality standards and using best practices for preschool children as identified by the nationally recognized organization.
