

Hayden tourney action on Saturday

Cowgirl transfers to University of Alaska

Goodland native Jayci Stone will play her senior season of college basketball for the Seawolves of the University of Alaska-Anchorage.

Stone, a 2003 graduate of Goodland High School, played her freshman and sophomore seasons at Colby Community College and her junior year at New Mexico State University. She played in 17 games, starting one, for the Lobos scoring 49 points and grabbing 11 rebounds. Stone averaged over 14 points per game as a sophomore for the Lady Trojans of Colby.

Joining Stone as a newcomer to the Seawolf basketball program is Coach Tim Moser, who was hired in April after coaching for eight seasons at Otero Junior College in Colorado. He coached both the men's and women's teams for the first six seasons then just the men for the next two.

"Jayci is an incredible competitor who simply knows how to win and does everything well," Moser said. "She adds versatility at the forward position, including the ability to step out for the three pointer.

Most importantly, she is the kind of player who is a leader and makes everyone around her even better."

Jayci is the daughter of Dennis and Karen Stone of Goodland. As a Cowgirl, she lettered volleyball and track as well as basketball, and still holds the school record in the pole vault at 11 feet.

Alaska-Anchorage is a NCAA Division II school in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference. The Seawolves were 13-14 overall this past season and 6-12 in the conference.

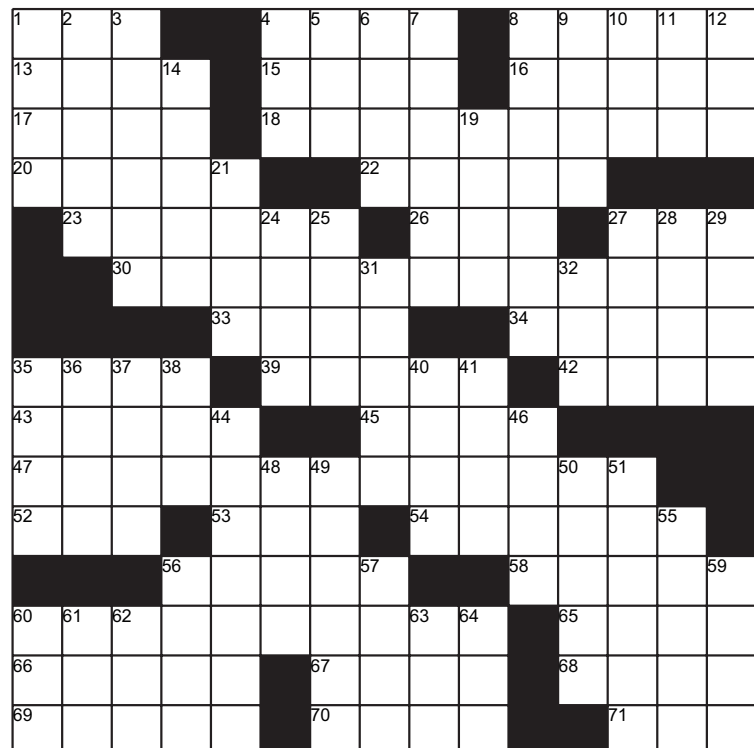
