

# Burlington ball team wins annual tourney

For the second year in a row, the Burlington American Legion Baseball team won the annual Levi Hayden Memorial Baseball Tournament on Sunday at Goodland's Centennial Field.

The Goodland team made it to the semifinals after two victories in pool play, but fell to Scott City in a close match.

Pool play in the eighth Hayden event started Saturday morning with a game between Scott City and Gove County. Scott City won 12-5.

The next game was the scholarship game, with Rhonda and Bill Hayden giving out the Levi Hayden Memorial Scholarships to Derek Fenner and Wyatt Dautel, Goodland High School players.

Jim Applebee was given a baseball hat and game ball for his continuing support of the Goodland baseball team. Bill Hayden started the game, between Goodland and Norton, by throwing out the first

ball.

Goodland held off Norton to win, 6-5. The winning pitcher, Torrie Elder, tossed 5 1/3 innings, and Wyatt Dautel came in for the save.

The third game was between Burlington and Scott City, with Burlington blasting Scott City, 22-7.

Imperial played Norton in the fourth game, winning 7-5.

The fifth game, between Gove County and Burlington, was interrupted by rain and stormy weather. It was the fourth year in a row storms had interrupted tournament play. The game was rescheduled for Sunday morning at 8 a.m., with Gove County losing to Burlington, 14-1.

The last game in pool play was between Imperial and Goodland.

"This ended up being the best overall played game of the tournament," Coach John Dautel said.

Goodland won, 3-2. Preston Dautel was the winning pitcher, going 6 1/3 innings before his

brother Wyatt picked up the save.

In bracket play, Imperial eliminated Gove County 14-5 and Scott City eliminated Norton 10-9.

In the semifinals, Burlington beat Imperial by 10, 15-5, and Goodland lost to Scott City. Goodland spotted the visitors six runs in the first two innings, battled back, but eventually losing 9-8.

In the championship between Scott City and Burlington, Burlington rolled over Scott City 8-3.

The Most Inspirational Player award went to two Goodland players, Randy Young and Wyatt Dautel.

Helping with the tournament were the Gordon Pettibone family, John Whisnant and Donna Finner.

The Goodland team includes the Dautels, Elder, Josh Doke, Young, Taylor Frazier, Tanner Smith, Tyler Hilmer, Forrest Trachsel, Brandon Zelfer, Tadd Taylor and Fenner. Fritz Doke helps with coaching and Sandra Terry is manager.

The Goodland swim team sponsored its annual swim meet at the Steever Water Park on Saturday, placing fifth in the Northwest Kansas League meet with a score of 129. Goodland swimmers finished first in seven events.

The 9-10 boys 100-yard freestyle relay team, Holton Witman, Austin Raines, Zach Miller and Gerrel Miller, set a pool record at 1 minutes, 28.81 seconds.

The 8-and-under mixed 100-yard freestyle relay crew, Sianna Miller, Simon Bassett, Kelsey White and Isaac Walton, finished first with

2:25.19.

Holton Witman had a big day, taking first in 9-10 boys 100-yard freestyle (1:26.97), 25-yard freestyle (15.53) and 25-yard backstroke (20.97).

Drew House was first in the 8-and-under boys 25-yard butterfly in 27.80 seconds, and Brennan Clouse took the 15-18 boys 100-yard breaststroke in 1:22.30.

Future meets will be in Wray, Colo., on Saturday; in Burlington Saturday, June 24; ; and the league championship in Colby on Friday and Saturday, July 7 and 8.
