**Sonrise Church to sell old, build new**

Before parishioners start spilling out onto the lawn, a Goodland church has decided it's time for a bigger building.

Members of the Sonrise Christian Church have voted to sell the church and parsonage at 901, 905 and 907 Caldwell and to look for land for a new church. Plans are being drawn for a new building,

said Pastor Charles Kerr; the congregation hopes the building will be ready in six to nine months.

Tom Harrison with Homeland Real Estate is listing the old property, Kerr said, at \$155,000. That would give the church enough money to build what it needs and be debt-free, the pastor said.

"Our auditorium only seats about 65," Kerr said. "It's not big enough."

The property, the former Sage

and Smith Funeral Home, is not conducive to church programs, he added, and it lacks space for classrooms and fellowship areas.

"We want to build something that functions as a church," he said, "and is more conducive to growth."

There is room for three apartments and a three-bedroom house on the property, Kerr said; it would make a lot better income property than it does a church.

Sonrise has been at the location about 20 years, he added.
