

Scott City wins Levi Hayden

The Scott City American Legion baseball team won the championship of the Levi Hayden Memorial Tournament on Saturday, June 10. Scott City rolled over the team from Burlington, 8-3. The team jumped out with an early lead and kept it.

Scott City won its first game against Gove County, 12-5, and lost to Burlington, 22-7 in the second game. Scott City eliminated Norton in pool play, 10-9. In the semifinals, Scott City beat Goodland, 9-8.

"Scott City is a good team," said

Goodland coach John Dautel, adding that Goodland will play Scott City there at 5 p.m. on Wednesday. Saturday, the team played at Burlington in the Dual State Invitational Tournament.

They lost 3-8 to Wray in the first game and lost to Ellicott, near Colorado Springs, 5-9. Tom Terry has joined the Goodland team, Dautel said.

On Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Goodland will play in a five-game round-robin tournament starting at 3:30 p.m. in Hays.

Three Cowboys on Wildcats' roster

When the Kansas State University football team takes the field at home Sept. 2, chances are the interest in Goodland will be even higher than usual, with three former Cowboys listed on the Wildcats' roster.

The 'Cats will play Illinois State University in their first home game at the Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

Senior tight end Donald Raymer will begin his second season at Kansas State after playing two seasons at Garden City Community College. Raymer did not see any playing time last season but did play in the team's spring game April 22.

Raymer caught three passes for 23 yards and scored the game's first touchdown, helping the White Squad defeat the Purple 21-14.

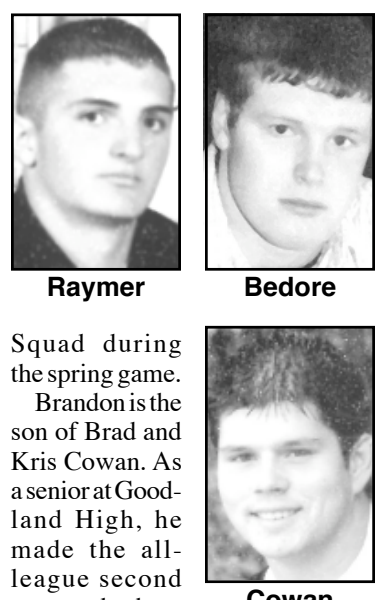
Raymer is the son of Steve and Debra Raymer of Goodland. He is a 2003 graduate of Goodland High, where he lettered in basketball and golf as well as football. As a senior, he was named to the All-Northwest Kansas League teams in both football and basketball.

Junior offensive lineman Jordan Bedore also will begin his second season after red shirting his first year at Kansas State. Last season, he played in all 11 games for the Wildcats, starting eight at center.

Jordan, a 2004 graduate of Goodland High, is the son of Dustin and Barb Bedore of Brewster. Besides football, he also lettered in wrestling and track. He was a three-time state Class 4A wrestling champion, winning the title at 215 pounds his sophomore and junior years and as a heavyweight his senior season.

As a football player, Bedore made the all-league first team as a running back and linebacker in both his junior and senior seasons.

Joining the Wildcats this year is Brandon Cowan, who graduated from Goodland High in 2005. He is listed on the team's roster as a long snapper and played for the Purple



Squad during the spring game.

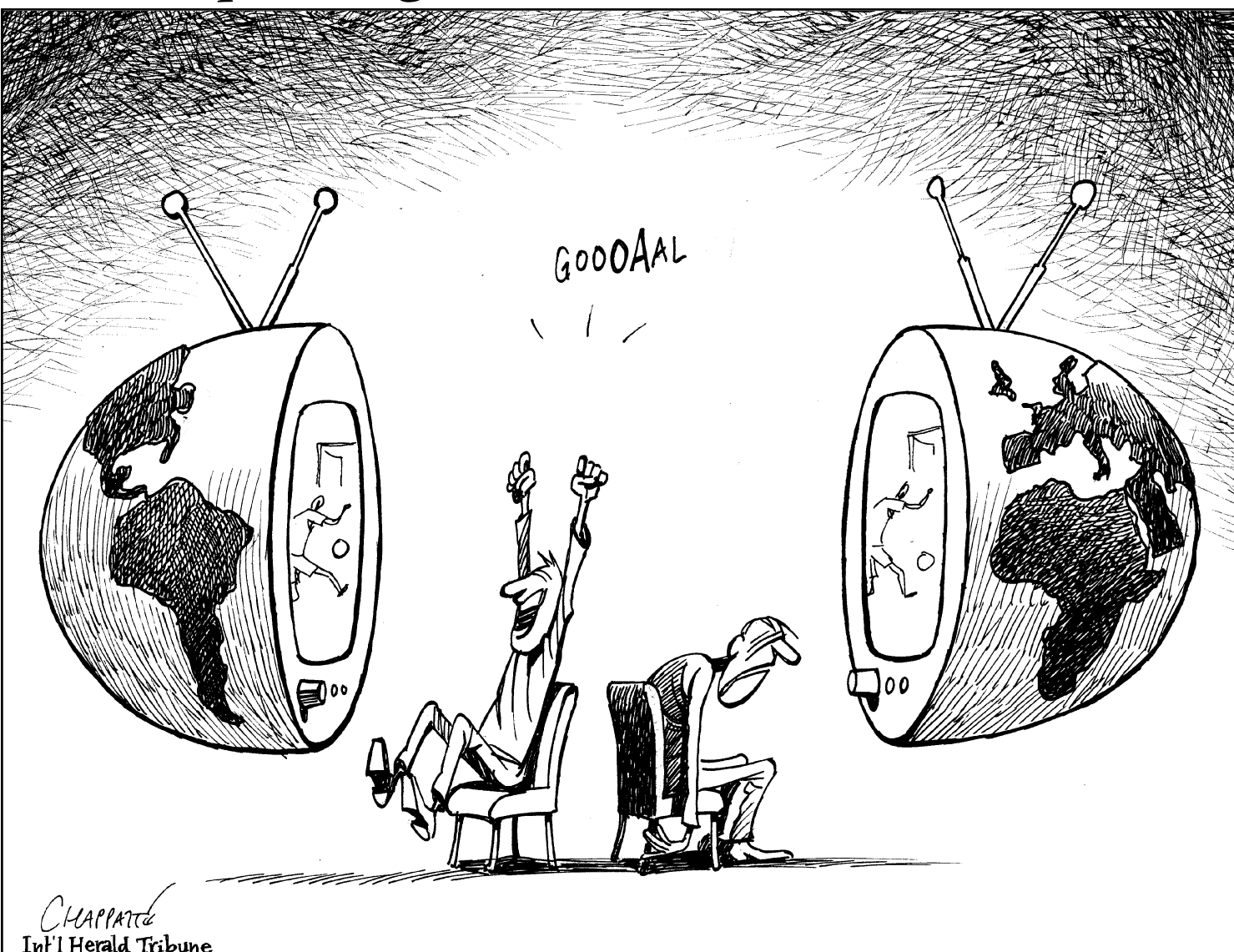
Brandon is the son of Brad and Kris Cowan. As a senior at Goodland High, he made the all-league second team as both an offensive tackle and defensive lineman.

K-State will play each Saturday Sept. 2 through Nov. 18, opening with four straight home games against nonconference opponents. After Illinois State, the Wildcats play Florida Atlantic University, Marshall University (W.Va.) then the University of Louisville.

The 'Cats begin conference play Sept. 30 at Baylor, followed by home games against Oklahoma State and Nebraska. After traveling to Columbia to play Missouri on Oct. 21, the Wildcats will face Iowa State a week later for homecoming.

K-State plays the Colorado Buffaloes in Boulder on Nov. 4 and will play Texas for the final home game of the season on Veterans Day. The Wildcats will close the regular season with their annual showdown against the Kansas Jayhawks in Lawrence on Nov. 18.
