Couple celebrates 55 years

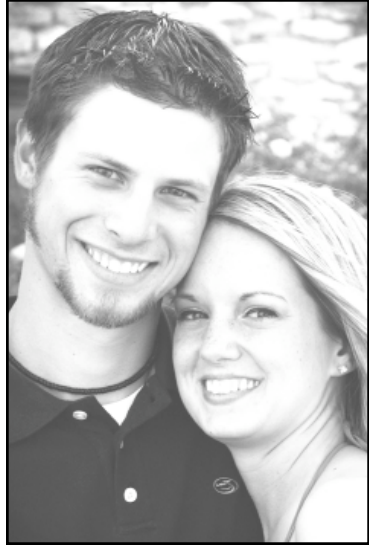

Pastor Ted Amos and Father Norbert Dlabal will officiate.

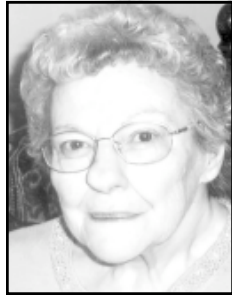
The bride-elect is the daughter of Bruce and Tina Gleason of Goodland, and the prospective groom is the son of Rick and Rita Billinger of Goodland.
