Shannon Ryan, a KU anthropology doctoral student from Salina, said the group, working at 106 has found flakes indicating ancient human activity, but no new tools. The flakes were created when the ancient people chipped at larger rocks to make stone tools or points. A scraper tool was found at the site last vear.

Hofman said a backhoe, loaned by the City of Kanorado, has made the progress this year more extensive than what was accomplished in the two weeks last year.

Hai Huang, a graduate student from Shanghai, China, worked at site 106 last year, but is working at 105 this summer. He said Friday this is probably his last year in Kan-found.
