More bones found near Kanorado

Shannon Ryan, a KU anthropology doctoral student from Salina, said the group, working at 106 has found flakes indicating ancient human activity, but no new tools. The flakes were created when the ancient people chipped at larger rocks to make stone tools or points. A scraper tool was found at the site last year.

Hofman said a backhoe, loaned by the City of Kanorado, has made the progress this year more extensive than what was accomplished in the two weeks last year.

Hai Huang, a graduate student from Shanghai, China, worked at site 106 last year, but is working at 105 this summer. He said Friday this is probably his last year in Kan-

sas, and will be heading back to China next year.

Huang said the excavation of the site was continued this year because a large mammoth vertebra was found there at the end of the field school. He said the crew turned up a mammoth rib and another bone on Thursday.

Geist, working at the 105 site, was excited about the bones.

Huang said the site had been dug back into the bank with the help of the backhoe, and there are more sections to be removed.

Nick Kessler of Lawrence, a senior at KU in anthropology, said the site at 106 has been dug back with the backhoe, and on the top of the bank a trench has been cut to see if the original arroyo edge can be found.

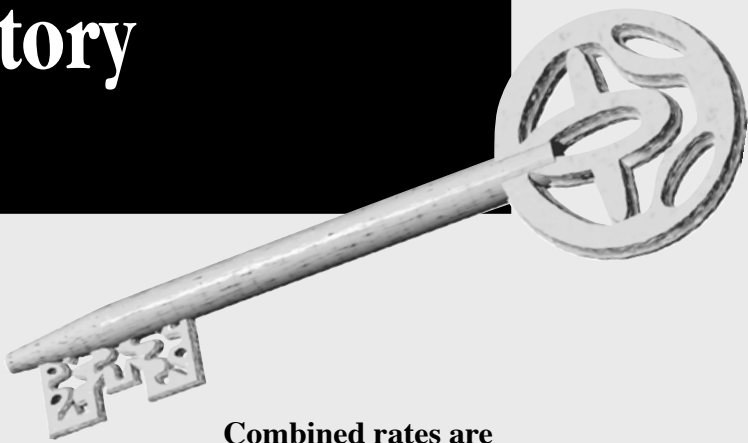

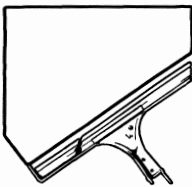
