Modifieds first on muddy track

Turning the line up around, the Modified cars took to the Sherman County Speedway first on Saturday to help pack the muddy track.

The racers will be back on the speedway on Saturday, July 22. The pits open at 3 p.m., and the races begin at 6 p.m.

Cloudy skies kept the temperature down, and the rains earlier in the week made the track sort of muddy. Before the races began, all the drivers were asked to drive the track to help pack it.

Alex West, racing association president, said the modified cars tend to run in a wider groove on the track, and with the muddy condition, having them run first gives the track more width for the other cars to run. He said with the wider groove, the cars can run three abreast.

Brady Coen (3) of Wiley, Colo., won the first modified heat and Darren DeLoach (21) of Lamar, Colo., won the second heat. In the Main feature, Coen won with DeLoach finishing second. In the point standings, Jeff Tubbs (37) of Colby, who finished third in the main, is tied with DeLoach at 177 points, and Coen is third with 171.

Troy Plummer (00) of Oakley won the stock main with Randy Tipton (9) of Weskan second. Tipton remains in on top of the point standings with 158, ahead of Jason Stevens (77) of Colby, who was third in the main, with 124.

Jeremy Blackwill (25) of Gem won the bomber main and is leading in the point standings with 199. Kyle Rohleder (3R) of WaKeeney, fourth in the main race, is second in the standings with 192.

Justin Colby (17) won the econo main, and remains on top the point standings with 187. The drivers in the econo class are all from Goodland.

Roger Snethen (S5) finished fifth in the econo main, but is second in the point standings with 183. Josh Colby (71) finished sixth in the main and is third in the standings with 180.

Jacob Long (71) of Burlington won the mini stock main, but is second in the standings to Brian Kleine (1), of Burlington, who was third in the mini stock main. Brian Kleine has 198 points to 195 for Long. Don Kleine (21), of Burlington, was second in the mini stock main, and is third in the point standings at 190.

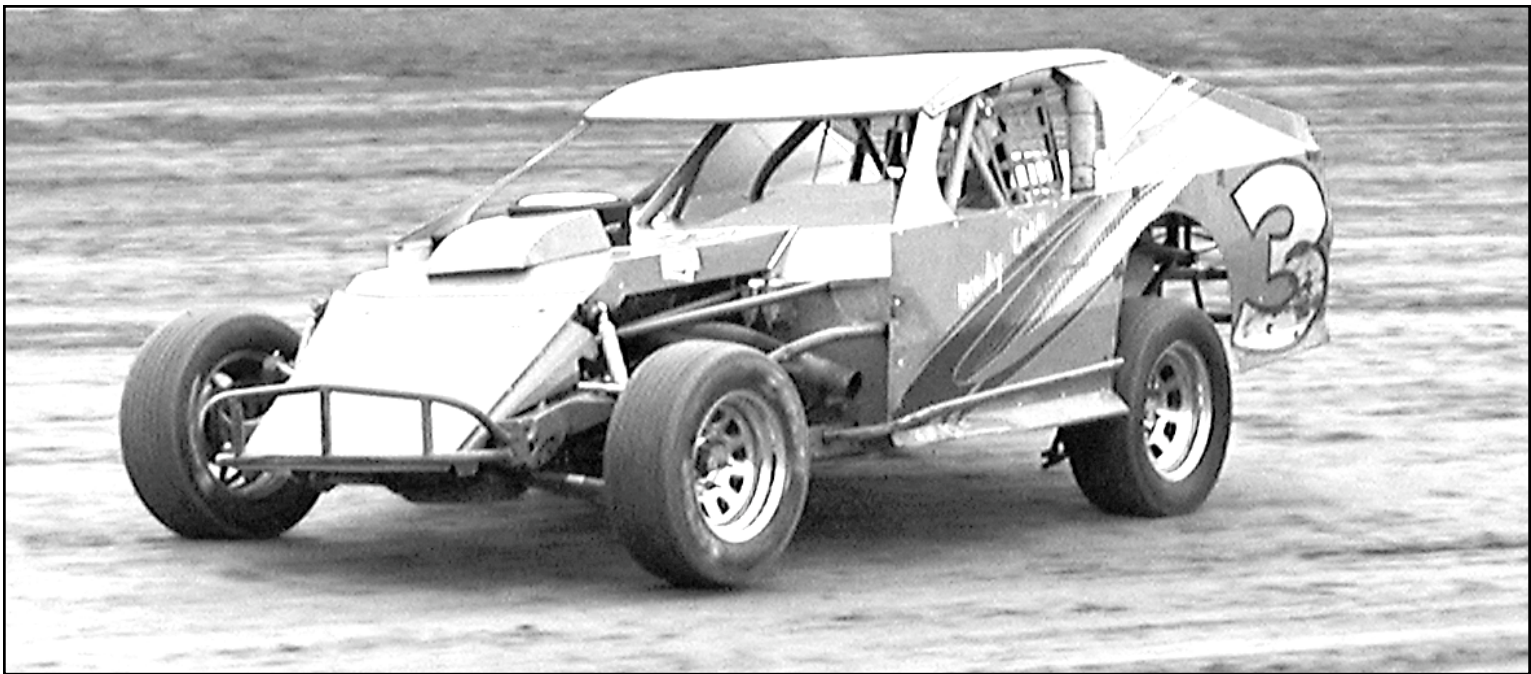

The Goodland Swim Team won five individual and three relay races at the Northwest Kansas Swim League Championships last weekend.

Riley Oharah was named two-day League Meet Champion, winning four events in 11-12 boys. The team placed sixth out of 10 teams at the meet.

Holton Witman in 9-10 boys won the fifth individual gold. Three relay teams won gold; 8-and-under mixed 100-yard (1:47.56) with Kelsey White, Alex Goodwin, Drew House and Sianna Miller; 9-10 mixed 100-yard freestyle (1:12.03) with Witman, Zach Miller, Taryn Bedore and Gerrel Miller; and 9-10 mixed 100-yard medley (1:24.06) with Gerrel Miller, Zach Miller, Whitman and Rachel Horney.

Other swimmers winning tro-

phies for season points were Sianna Miller (8-and-under girls) for sixth place and 46 points; Drew House (8-and-under boys) fourth with 70 points; Gerrel Miller (9-10 boys) sixth with 68 points; Zach Miller (9-10 boys) fourth with 84 points; Witman (9-10 boys) second with 103 points; Oharah (11-12 boys) fifth with 69 points; and Brennan Clouse (15-18 boys) fifth with 68 points.

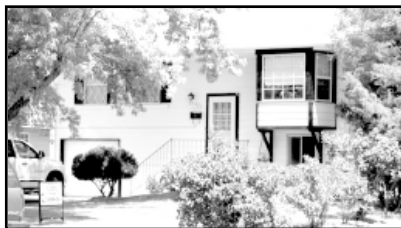
