
Area driver rolls his car

The Lady Trojans, topping the list with a 3.458 average, were the only team from the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference to make the association's Academic Honor Roll.

Colby, under Coach Tom Stephens, went 32-5 last season, earning a spot in the National Junior College Athletic Association Division I championship tournament and finishing the season ranked No. 7.
