Seaman said a desire to capture the beauty of his travels during his time in the Navy drove him to photography in 1972. Since then he has focused his lens on subjects including landscapes, flowers and animals.

He graduated from Goodland High School in 1961, and in 1992 received a culinary degree and operated his own catering business in Seattle. Today he is semi-retired in Goodland, where he lives with his wife Charlene on his

family's farmstead.

He said his father, who took black-and-white photos and showed him how to develop the film and prints, introduced him to photography. Later, during his travels, he used photography to record the places he visited.

"I try to capture a mood of a place so it triggers a feeling in someone in addition to the beauty of the place," he said.

The gallery show will be on display through Wednesday, Aug. 30. Homeland Real Estate of Goodland sponsored the exhibit. Gallery hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and 1 to 4 p.m. Saturday, Sunday and Monday. Admission is free.
