## Two play in all-star marching band

Goodland's Mark Starr will be one of 66 Kansas football players on television Saturday night as the West meets the East for the 33rd annual Kansas Shrine Bowl in Pittsburg.

Kickoff will be shortly after 6 p.m. Mountain Time in Carnie Smith Stadium at Pittsburg State University.

The game will be broadcast by all Kansas public television stations, cable channel 2 for both Eagle and S&T customers in Goodland, starting with the pregame show at 5 p.m.

Starr will be one of 33 players on the West Squad, which will be looking to break the East's two-game win streak. The East won last year 17-10 in Manhattan and 29-12 in 2004.

# Elks K-18 team makes state tourney in Lucas

Goodland's Elks K-18 baseball team will be in Lucas on Saturday to play in the league's 55th annual state tournament.

Saturday at 5:30 p.m., Goodland will face the No. 1 seed from the east, Clifton-Clyde. If Goodland wins, the team will play on Sunday against the winner of the game between Concordia F&A, the No. 3 seed from the east, and Ellis, the No. 2 seed from the west.

Colby, which won the regional tournament in Russell last weekend, plays about 7:30 p.m. today against Belleville K-18. Colby is the top seed from the West and Belleville is the No. 4 seed from the east.

The first game of the state tournament today at 5:30 p.m. has Quinter, the No. 3 seed from the west, facing Beloit, the No. 2 seed from the east.

Scott Waugh, father of a Goodland player, said he had been told the Goodland's K-18 team has not been to a state tournament in about 15 years.

Goodland finished fourth in the regional tournament last weekend in Russell. The team won its first game Friday against Russell, 3-2, with Rory Kling pitching.

Goodland jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the first inning on runs scored by Dillon Trachsel, Kevin

Amthor and Kling. Kling gave up a run in the second, then shut Concordia out until the top of the seventh, when they got a run to make it close. Kling struck out the next batter and the fifth batter in the inning to secure the win, 3-2.

The second game was called after three innings with Goodland losing to Ellis 28-2. Cameron Morris was the starting pitcher, but was replaced by Brandon Rome in the second. Adam Duell came in as the Goodland pitcher in the third.

Goodland's two runs came in the second inning after a lead-off single by Kling. Kling stole second base, but Ellis' pitcher Jacob Kinderknecht had a momentary lapse of control and walked three batters, allowing Kling and Rome to score for Goodland.

On Sunday, Goodland fell behind Quinter in the first inning, but came back to make it close, losing 10-6. Goodland scored three runs in the second and three in the seventh.

Rome had 11 strike-outs, gave up four hits and walked 16. Goodland had nine errors in the game.

Quinter scored two in the first, added a run each in the second and the third and two in the fourth, fifth and seventh to win 10-6.

# Econo driver knocked out after car rolls six times

A Goodland driver was knocked out for a few minutes after his car rolled six times in the Econo main race at the Sherman County Speedway on Saturday.

Alex West, president of the racing association, said he counted the rolls of the car even as he drove his four-wheel cycle toward the multi-car pile up on turn two. West said none of the other cars was damaged.

West said Ricky Pummer (car 13) had finished in the top four of his heat, but the crash took him out of the running in the main. West said Pummer was sort of fighting the rescue workers and firemen as they worked to get him out of the car.

"The rescue people were able to get him out without having to cut up the car," West said.

Pummer was taken to the hospital to be checked out.

"He was OK," West said, "and I saw him at the races in Colby on Sunday."

There had been some minor spinout in the preliminary heats, West said, and one involved three cars, but there was no damage and the races continued.

West said two drivers lost wheels during the races, and one car lost the engine hood during hot laps. One of the cars that lost a wheel had a broken axle, he added.

The cars have a few weeks' break to get things in shape for the 14th annual Bill Gray Memorial on Saturday, Aug. 19. West said the 305 Sprint Car series may appear that night along with the regular racing classes.

Darren DeLoach (21) of Lamar, Colo., won his modified heat, and the modified cash dash. DeLoach had been tied with Jeff Tubbs (37) of Colby in the track standings. With a win in the modified main, DeLoach moved ahead of Tubbs by four points with 217. Tubbs won his heat, but finished fifth in the main event and is second with 213 points.

Brady Coen (3) of Wiley, Colo., closed the gap a bit in the standings, finishing second in the modified main event. Coen had won the modified main on July 8 over DeLoach and moved into third place in the standings. Coen is three points behind Tubbs and seven behind DeLoach.

Jacob Long (71) of Burlington won his second mini stock main, and is closing in on the track leader Brian Kleine (1) of Burlington. Kleine is leading the mini stock standings with 237 points, and Long is two points behind at 235. Don Kleine (21) of Burlington was third in the mini stock main, and is third in the standings with 228
