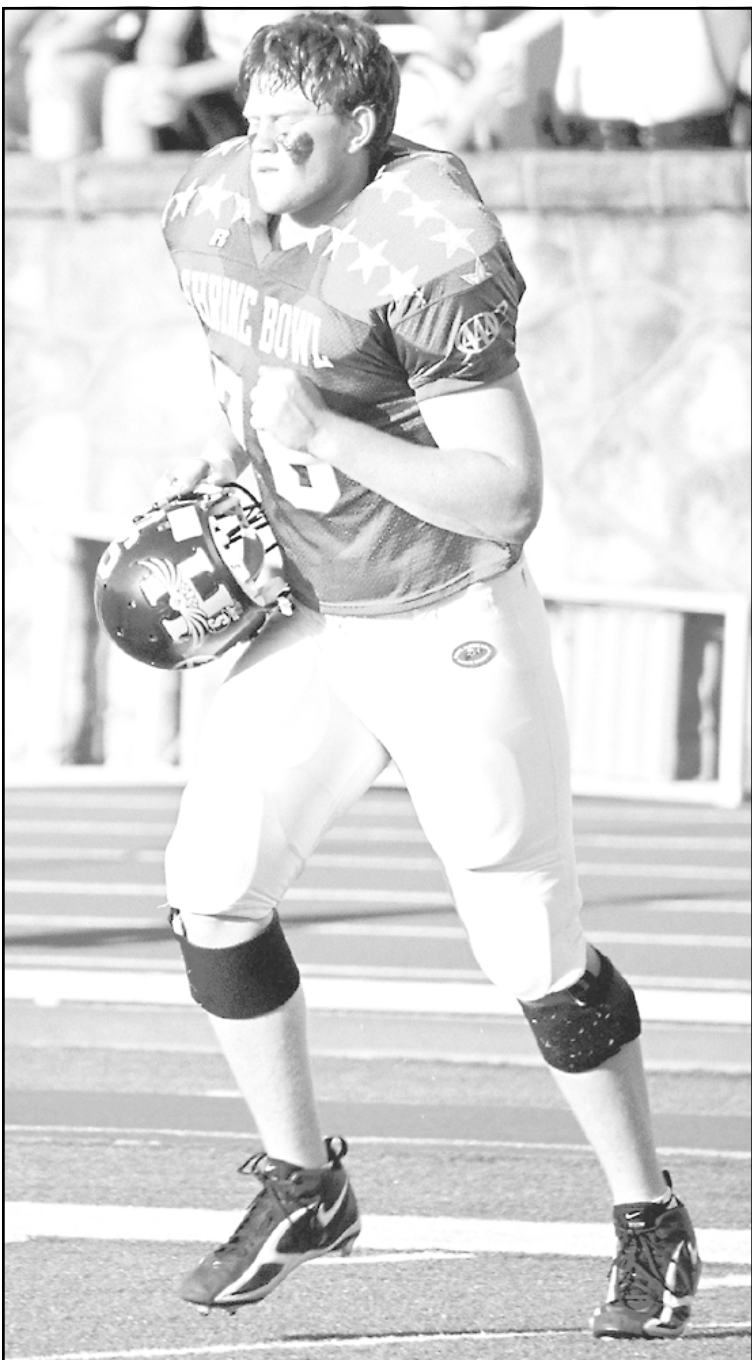




Cowboy helps West to victory

Brewster High senior Dani Bedore's club volleyball team, the Colorado Juniors 17's, placed ninth at the National Junior Olympic tournament July 2 to 5 in Atlanta.

Bedore is the daughter of Dustin and Barb Bedore and granddaughter of Glenna and Waldo Jarmin.

To play in the tournament, a team had to place in the top three in open division at an earlier qualifying tournament.

The Colorado Juniors 17's took

first at the Denver Crossroads Tournament and third at tournaments in Las Vegas and Reno, Nev.

The team flew out of Denver on Friday, June 30. They stayed at the 28-floor Omni Hotel, where CNN News is on the fourth floor. The hotel is next to the site of the 1996 Olympics, near the 60 volleyball courts at the Phillips Area.

The team practiced Friday night and Saturday. They played their first pool game at 8 a.m. on Sunday

morning.

The 17's division had 28 teams divided into four pools of seven each. The top three teams in each pool advanced to the top eight. The Colorado girls tied for second, had a crossover match and lost. The team went 6-3 for the four-day tournament.

The champions were from Minnesota and the runner up team from Chicago.
