

Veterans name Eagle Scout of Year

A 2006 graduate of Goodland High School has been named as the Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Kansas Eagle Scout of the Year.

Matt Rohr, son of Tom and Colleen Rohr, finished his Eagle Scout project in July 2005. He received a plaque and \$400 check from Larry Rowlinson, the Veterans' 9th District commander, at the Lowell-Coleman Post meeting on Tuesday, Aug. 1.

Rohr's project a flag pole for Pioneer Park at Business U.S. 24 and

Cherry Avenue. The pole is made up of 10-inch, 8-inch and 6-inch diameter steel pipe that is a quarter inch thick. The first thing he did was wash the pipe to get it ready for welding, Rohr said.

Rohr got a chance to do some of the welding but he had help from Chuck Lutters, project coordinator for JMC Engineering. The next thing, Rohr did was paint the flag pole white. He did most of the work in the lot south of Dependable Glass, his father's business.

The Goodland city crew dug a four-foot by four-foot by eight-foot-deep hole for the pole.

After the pole was set up, Rohr said, ties were attached to keep it in place. The cement needed 72 hours to cure. On the top of the pole is an 18 inch eagle. The flag is 10 feet by 15 feet.

The pole was designed by Lutters to keep the flag from twisting. A wheel bearing allows the flag to turn in the direction of the wind. The location was picked by the city.

He said the project cost about \$1,500, which he had to raise. He got help from Short and Son, Inc.; Jim Bowker; Lutters; city workers including Lucas Wolak, Charlie Bandel and Dustin Bedore; his father; Rhodes Construction; Schlosser Concrete and fellow Scouts Jonathan McClung and Zach Breninger.


