Goodland graduate starting her third season

Former Cowgirl Alisha McKee begins her third season with the California State University, Fresno volleyball team when the Lady Bulldogs face the University of California, Santa Barbara on Friday, Aug. 25.

The home match against the Lady Gauchos is just the start of a busy weekend, as the Bulldogs take on Kansas State University later that day in the opening round of the Fresno State Invitational. The team will play the University of the Pacific on the following Saturday and Santa Clara University on Sunday.

McKee, a 2004 graduate of Goodland High, played in 25 of 28 matches for the Bulldogs last season, start-

ing 21. She recorded a career high 23 kills against Louisiana Tech University on Oct. 15. McKee was fourth on the team in kills and second in blocks.

Alisha is the daughter of Jerry and Linda McKee of Goodland. As a senior, she helped lead the Cowgirls to the 2003 Class 4A state championship. Alisha also lettered in basketball and track in high school, qualifying twice for the state meet in the shot put.

Fresno State finished 7-21 last season and was 4-12 in the Western Athletic Conference. The Bulldogs placed sixth of nine teams in the conference coaches' preseason poll this year.

The University of Hawaii was picked to win its 11th straight conference title, getting eight first-place votes. Hawaii was ranked No. 7 in the NCAA Division I preseason poll released last week by the American Volleyball Coaches Association.



