# Controlling volunteer wheat key to preventing wheat streak mosaic

mosaic - three little words that can put fear into a farmer's heart.

The high level of infection that we had last season

controlling volunteer wheat before this year's crop is planted.

With the scattered rains that we have had, the volunteer wheat will begin to appear. Volunteer wheat that is within half a mile of a wheat field can pose a threat to newly planted (or soon to be planted) wheat.

The wheat curl mite moves the wheat streak mosaic virus. These tiny insects throw themselves into the wind and land on the next available wheat field.

A good indicator of the mite's presence is the edge of the wheat blade being curled up tight. This curled edge may not always be evident, so closer examination may be necessary.
