Mac Anderson

Mac Anderson, 79, Goodland, died Wednesday, Aug. 23, 2006, at Goodland Regional Medical Center.

He was born Sept. 12, 1926, in Sherman County, the son of Perl and Georgia (Doggett) Anderson. When he was 4, the family moved to the farmstead southwest of Edson.

Anderson attended school in Edson and was drafted into the Army in 1944, serving in World War II in the Philippines and Korea.. He returned in 1947 on leave to attend his father's funeral.

After service, he returned to farm with his mother and sister Joy and her husband Gene Anderson.

On Aug. 22, 1948, he married Ruby Nowak from Goodland at the courthouse in Colby. They lived in a small tenant house they bought from a neighbor.

In 1949, Joy and Gene and son Harold moved to Colorado because of Harold's asthma. Mac and Ruby moved into the house with his mother and lived their until she remarried and left the farm in their care. In 1954, they bought the farm from his family.

On Oct. 4, 1950, their first son was born, and on March 30, 1953, a second son joined the family.

In the lean years from 1955 to the 1960s, Mr. Anderson worked at the Leslie Tire Shop in Goodland
