## Wind farm proposed southwest of Goodland

Simons said. "Probably 33 wind towers. We believe we could handle up to about 80 megawatts on the Sunflower power line."

He said the towers would be 80 meters (260 feet) tall and the arc of the blades would be 400 feet. The wind farm would cover about four sections, depending on the lay of the ground, he said.

"You have to spread them out," he said. 'The major wind direction has a lot to do with how they are laid out. The towers are in line perpendicular to the main line of wind and spread out three blade widths

apart. The foundations are 30 feet from Tennessee would handle square and deep. You can farm up to the edge. All the lines are underground and then we build a

substation .....'
