of Hoxie drilled the well.

“Armstrong services the wells,” Thomas said. “No one in Sherman County drills wells. You have to go out of the county to get a well driller. We have two companies who service wells and pumps.”

Thomas said caretaker Bob McClure was pleased with the new well.

In other business, the commissioners:

- Added a date line to a bidding form for out-of-town purchases to be used by all departments.
- Reviewed and approved two neighborhood revitalization projects, a house remodeling for Gordon Colip, 321 Sycamore, and a new garage for Kyle Parish, 212 E. Second.
- Discussed the Partners pro-

gram, with the Kansas Highway Patrol that allows partners to purchase at a lower group rate, that Sheriff Kevin Butts mentioned at the previous meeting. Commissioner Kevin Rasure asked the other commissioners what they thought of the program.

Both Thomas and Mitch Tiede said they thought it was more for the sheriff’s equipment.

Tiede said it would be good to check to see what the difference might be in cost. Thomas said it would be good to look at the program to see what it does.

Rasure said he felt that with cars and other equipment, he wanted to be sure they are buying from local dealers.

“We would have to check about service,” Tiede said. “There is lots to look at.”

“We would get a price compari-

son,” Thomas said.

“I feel our car dealers treat us very well,” Rasure said.

“The price is only one factor in the consideration,” Tiede said. “There are many things that are part of the decision.”

- Asked County Clerk Janet Rumpel how she was coming with the budget. Rumpel said she was getting everything ready. There was a glitch on salary amounts and the first payroll of the year was not pulled into the totals, she said, but she is going back and adding the figures in.

She asked the commissioners if they wanted to leave the \$50,000 in for economic development.

“Put it in for now,” Rasure said.

“I have left the rest alone at the same rate we have been giving,” Rumpel said.

All three commissioners agreed

to leave the requests by other agencies as they have been.

The commissioners will meet at 8 a.m. on Thursday to close the month. They will not have a meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 5, but will meet on Tuesday, Sept. 12.

Rasure said if they need to review the budget, they could meet sometime before Sept. 12.

The commissioners held a closed session with Rumpel for three minutes on a personnel matter. When they returned to open session, they asked Rumpel to talk to County Attorney Bonnie Selby about putting in an ad for help.

The commissioners held a 10-minute closed session to discuss land acquisition. When they returned, no action was taken.

The meeting began at 8 a.m. and adjourned at 10:40 a.m.

Wind farm proposed southwest of Goodland

Simons said. “Probably 33 wind towers. We believe we could handle up to about 80 megawatts on the Sunflower power line.”

He said the towers would be 80 meters (260 feet) tall and the arc of the blades would be 400 feet. The wind farm would cover about four sections, depending on the lay of the ground, he said.

“You have to spread them out,” he said. “The major wind direction has a lot to do with how they are laid out. The towers are in line perpendicular to the main line of wind and spread out three blade widths.

“The lines are about a half mile apart. The foundations are 30 feet square and deep. You can farm up to the edge. All the lines are underground and then we build a

substation”

“Anything we need to do special from the county?” Commissioner Kevin Rasure asked.

Simons said there may be some environmental issues because the wind farm is about two miles from a state wildlife area.

“We will do public meetings if we get the contract from Sunflower,” he said.

Simons said the wind farm would provide some jobs.

“Not a lot,” he said, “be a range of five to six full-time working on the wind farm. They would handle daily maintenance and be the permanent staff.”

Thomas asked about construction. Simons said a company from Tennessee would handle the construction, using as much local help as possible.

Rob Beckley said they had the basic concept shots all done, and the

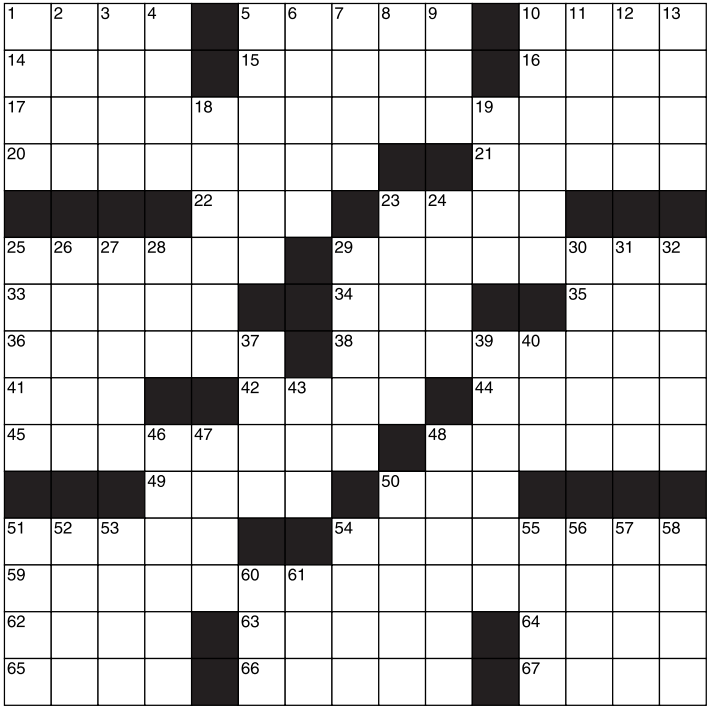
scene at the barn is the final piece to put it all together. They arrived at the Duell farm in the morning, and spent most of the day setting up the lights and shooting the other shots, he said.
