Livengood said, “a lot of depth and experience.”

There are no beginners, she added; the freshmen played junior golf in the summer.

“Everyone’s serious about playing golf,” she said. “I’m really excited.”

Last year, the Cowgirls had their biggest golf team, the coach said, with 18 members. This year, some of those girls are working, she said,

and others are playing tennis.

It’s OK, she said; they were all first-time golfers last year and just decided to do something else.

For the season opener, Goodland will take six varsity and two junior varsity golfers to WaKeeney for the Trego Community High tournament.

Then the Cowgirls will be hosts of the Goodland Invitational starting at 1 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 5, at Sugar Hills Golf Club. It’s a varsity and junior varsity tournament, but

with 10 on the team, Livengood said, the Cowgirls may be split into two varsity teams to give them all some experience.

Six would play varsity anyway, she said, so they may just split five and five.

“I really think these kids can go a long way this year,” she said. “They are good kids and have good work ethics.”
