Opening on the road shouldn't be a problem, said. first-year Coach Jonathan Dansel.

"It doesn't bother me," he said. "I don't have a preference. We have to get the boys prepared and be ready to take on what is in the schedule."

Dansel said he expects Atwood to have a solid team like always with Coach Dan Lankas in his 30th season, even though the Buffalos were 3-7 last year.

"We beat them last year," Dansel said, "but that doesn't mean much. We are not looking past them. We

want to be 1-0 going into St. Francis." Dansel said one of his assistants, Joseph Sramek, lives in Atwood.

Dansel said the Cowboys have to be ready to play on the road because they have a tough away schedule that will sort of set the tone for the season.

The Cowboys are out of town for four of their first five games. They open Friday at Atwood, then travel to St. Francis (Friday, Sept. 8) before coming home to play Hoxie (Friday, Sept. 15). The Cowboys are back on the road for games in Scott City (Sept. 22) and Hays (Sept. 29). Dansel said he had hoped to evaluate some players and make decisions after the scrimmage, but now he will have to watch them during the next week of practice.

"Lots of positions are set," Dansel said, "but a few key ones are up in the air. I needed the soap scrimmage, which was rained out last Friday, to evaluate some of those.

"This week of practice will be telling. We have to put the people we feel will win in the positions.

"I have to do some thinking and put some people in the places where we think they can do the best."

He said the players were as dis-

evaluate some players and make appointed as he was about the soap decisions after the scrimmage, but scrimmage.

"They were ready to be out there and show the people what we are gong to be about," Dansel said.

Asked about the quarterback position, Dansel said Wednesday he would give Josh Doke the nod to start the game at Atwood, and may play Travis Angelos depending on how the game goes.

He will rotate three players as receivers Tyler Hillmer, Forest Trachsel and Brandon Fontenot with An-

The final four games of the season begin with homecoming on Oct. 6 against Oakley. District play will begin on Oct. 13 with Ulysses at Cowboy Stadium. The Cowboys travel to Hugoton on Oct 20, and the final district game is at home against Colby on Thursday, Oct. 26.
