

Football season to open tonight on Atwood field

The Cowboys will open their football season at 6 p.m. Mountain Time tonight in Atwood against the Rawlins County Buffaloes.

First-year Coach Jonathan Dansel said Wednesday he has selected his starters, and expects it to be a good game.

Dansel said he will open with junior Josh Doke (No. 7) at quarterback. Coach Dansel said it was a close decision between Doke and sophomore Travis Angelos (No. 11).

"I may play Angelos," Dansel said, "depending on how the game is going. Doke is a team captain, and I like having his leadership on the field."

In the backfield, Dansel said he is relying on juniors T.J. Hawkins

(No. 9) and Casey Henderson (No. 3) to carry the ball.

Dansel said he will rotate three players at receiver, including sophomore Brandon Fontenot (No. 6), senior Tyler Hillmer (No. 85) and junior Forest Trachsel (No. 83). Dansel said he may use Angelos as a fourth receiver if he is not at quarterback.

Dansel said opening on the road is not a problem, but he hopes the Goodland fans will travel to Atwood to see the team.

"The boys are excited," Dansel said. "They want to show the people the new team and their new attitude."

The Cowboys will be on the road again next week as they travel north to St. Francis to face the Indians. The home opener will be on Sept. 15 against Hoxie.

Cowgirls practice their putts

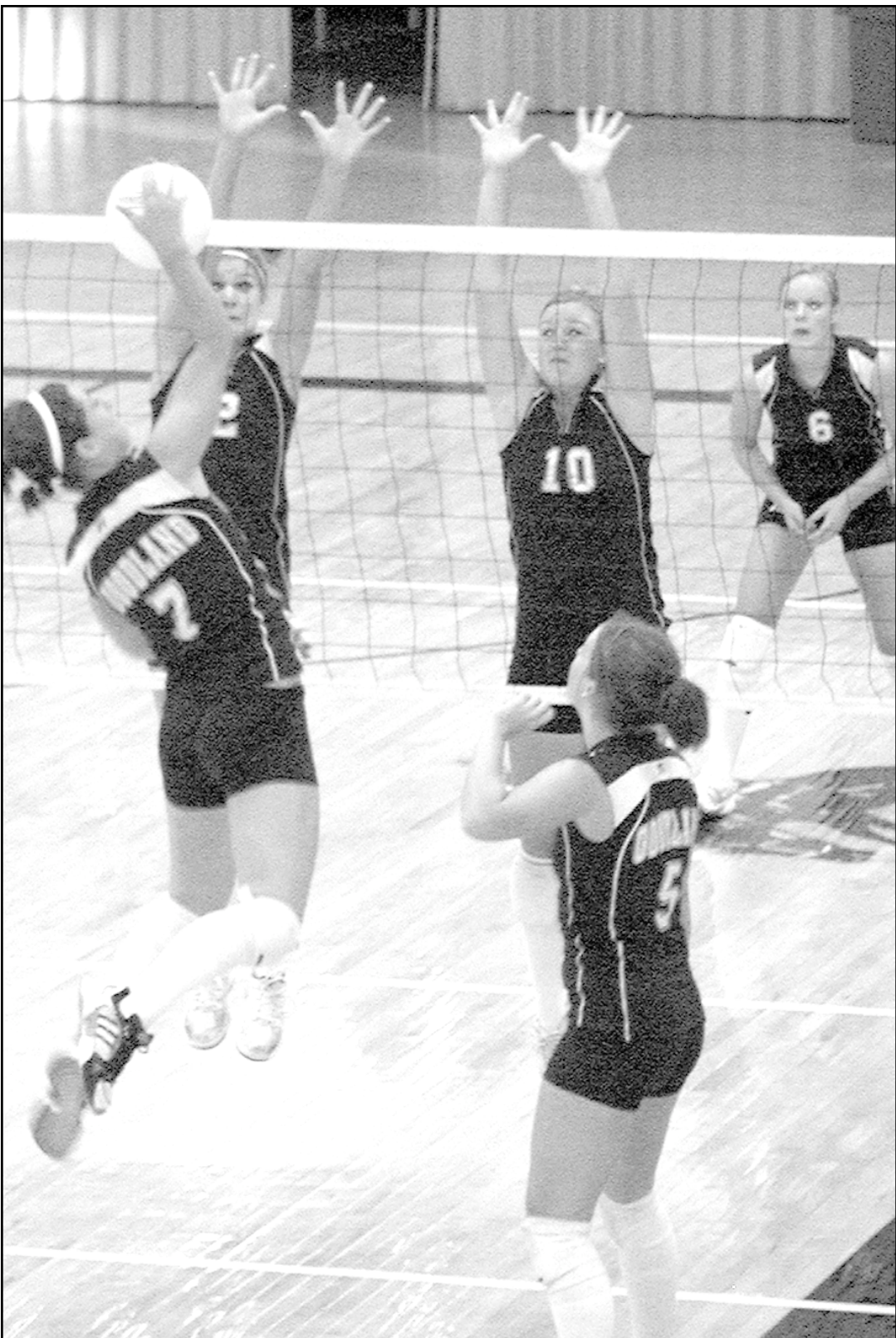


Courtney Sheldon (right) practiced putting Monday afternoon, and Amber Douglas (left) and Hannah Blake waited for their shot.

Tennis team ties for first again

The Cowgirls tennis team scored 19 points to tie host Phillipsburg for first on Tuesday, the second meet where the team has tied for first.

The first was at Cimarron last Thursday.

Victoria finished fourth at Phillipsburg and Osborne was third with 16 points.

In No. 1 singles, Goodland's Jillian Parker finished second. She lost to Sloane Hardman of Osborne 8-3 and won over Melinda Schremmer, Phillipsburg, 8-6 and

Kasandra Huser, Victoria, 8-3. Parker, Hardman and Schremmer were all state qualifiers last year. Jillian, 6-2 for the season, also placed second at Cimarron.

In No. 1 doubles, Jena McCall and Sandy Johnson won their second gold by beating Efken and Wolters, Osborne, 8-4; Jarvis and Runnin, Phillipsburg, 8-5; and Hansen and Schleisser, Victoria, 8-1. The three wins boosted their season record to 8-0.

In No. 2 singles, Kathy Wood finished with a 1-2 record. She beat Mangold, Victoria, 8-7, (7-4) and lost to Cole, Phillipsburg, 8-0 and

Malmberg, Osborne, 8-0. This was Wood's first varsity competition.

In No. 2 doubles, Shonna Webster and Kaitlin Fugleberg finished 1-2. Their second match went to tie breakpoint, but they lost it 8-7 (7-5) to Hadley and Mongeau, Phillipsburg. They also lost to Gregory and Koops, Osborne, 8-6. Their win came over Schmidtberger and Haerick, Victoria, 8-2. Their record so far this season is 5-3.

The Cowgirls will be in action at 8 a.m. (Mountain Time) on Saturday at Colby in an eight-team invitational.

Former Cowboy top tackler

Former Goodland Cowboy Derrick Raymer led the Garden City Community College football team in tackles last Saturday in Texas as the Broncbusters defeated Trinity Valley Community College of Athens, Texas, 21-17.

Raymer, a sophomore in his second season, had 10 tackles, six solo, and an interception as a defensive back as Garden City built up a 21-0 lead before the home team could get on the scoreboard. He punted six times, averaging over 40 yards per kick with two touchbacks.

Raymer kicked all three extra points for the 'Busters but missed three field goals attempts.

The Cardinals trailed 21-7 at halftime, scoring another touchdown in the third quarter, then scored on a field goal in the fourth.

Both teams were ranked in the National Junior College Athletic Association preseason poll, with Trinity Valley No. 2 and Garden City No. 15. Other teams of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference making the top 25 were Butler County at No. 3 and Coffeyville at No. 9.

The Broncbusters open conference play Saturday in El Dorado as they take on the Grizzlies of Butler County, who opened their season with a 26-0 road win over Kilgore College in Texas.
