The Goodland Star-News The weather was chilly for the first of September, and the Cowboys football team wound up on the chilly end of a 20-6 game against the Rawlins County Buffaloes in Atwood on Friday.

The Goodland defense did its part most of the night, but the offense was as cool at the evening air.

"The defense looked good all night — for the most part," said Cowboys Coach Jonathan Dansel. "They did give up a few big plays."

The first quarter was a defensive struggle, with Goodland stopping the Buffaloes on two drives and recovering a fumble at midfield. The Cowboys were unable to move the ball.

The Buffaloes moved from their 24, and after a 34-yard run by sophomore Drew Basgall, they had a first down at the Cowboys 20. On third down, Cowboys junior T.J. Hawkins caught senior Justin Howard in the backfield for a sixyard loss. On fourth down, the Buffaloes tried a screen pass, but it was short, giving the ball back to the Cowboys on their 20.

On first down, junior quarterback Josh Doke went back to pass, but he was caught from behind by a Buffalo and lost the ball. Atwood recovered at the Cowboys' 13 with less than a minute in the quarter.

Basgall carried the ball three times to make it fourth and goal from the 2 at the end of the quarter.

Atwood scored on the first play of the second period to lead 6-0. The extra point hike went over the head of the kicker, who tried to pick it up and throw a pass to senior Ben Warta, but it fell incomplete.

Senior Tyler Hillmer returned the kick off to the Cowboys' 28 to start the team's first possession of the second quarter.

Junior running back Casey Henderson broke through the middle for nearly 10 yards to give the Cowboys some life. On second and inches, T.J. Hawkins broke free for a 62-yard run and a touchdown to tie the score at 6 with 11:22 left in the half.

The point after-try by junior Ren Scherling was no good, as the snap rolled back to him. He tried to pass the ball to a Cowboy in the end zone.

The Cowboys stopped the Buffaloes on the next drive and got the ball back on their 20. The Cowboys moved out for a first down at the 31, but were unable to move, and had their first punt downed at the Buf-

ball at their 48.

On the third play of the drive, freshman Devin Wolters broke free for 35 yards before being taken out of bounds at the Cowboys 6 by Travis Angelos. Basgall punched the ball in from the one-foot line with 2:36 left in the third period. Sophomore Jackson Grafel ran wide around right end to make the score 20-6.

Goodland had the ball at the end of the third quarter, and faced a punting situation with 11:43 remaining. The Buffaloes took a time out. The snap went over the head of Scherling and was downed at the Cowboys 15.

The defense stepped up and Hillmer intercepted a pass to stop a Buffalo drive. However, on the next play Doke threw behind his receiver and it was picked off by Migchelbrink and returned to the Cowboys' 3.
