# Girls' varsity tennis team takes second at home meet

The Goodland High girls varsity tennis team came away from its home invitational meet with second place Tuesday.

Matches were held at Chambers, Gulick and Steever parks, finishing under the lights at Steever.

In No. 1 singles, Brooke Boulaware of Scott City beat Goodland senior Jillian Parker, 7-3, for the gold. Logan Wark won the bronze in a match with Siebert of Garden City, 7-0.

Parker had a 3-1 record with wins over Siebert, 7-1; Wineinger of Tribune, 7-; and Brooks of Norton, 7-2. Her season record is 12-5.

In No. 1 doubles, seniors Jena McCall and Sandy Johnson beat Wilson and Dugger of Colby, 7-2, for the gold. McCall and Johnson finished 4-0 with wins over Irwin and Walz of Garden City, 7-3; Fuller and Schmidt of Tribune, 7-2; and Jones and Marx of Norton, 7-2.

"This is their first season of var-

sity tennis, and their improvement continues to show," Hansen said of the girls.

With eight teams at the meet, Colby came in first with 34 points, Goodland second with 29, Scott City third 24, WaKeeney fourth 23, Garden City fifth 19, Ulysses sixth 14, Tribune seventh 11 and Norton last at 6.

The next meet for the varsity is at 1 p.m. Monday at the Scott City Invitational. Goodland will hold a six-team junior varsity meet at 2 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 19.

"Jena and Sandy played solid tennis in all four of their matches," said Coach Wallace Hansen.

McCall and Johnson's record for the season is 14-3.

In No. 2 singles, sophomore Sandra Redlin finished sixth with a 1-3 record, beating Jennifer Fuller of Tribune, 7-5. Bickner of Colby won the gold by defeating McNeil of Garden City, 7-2, in the championship match. Buxman of Ulysses won the bronze, 7-5, over Wagoner of Norton.

In No. 2 doubles, Goodland sophomores Shonna Webster and Kaitlin Fugleberg won the silver. They had wins over Prince and Brandt of Garden City, 7-2; Moritz and Wentz of Tribune, 7-3; and Fulton and Shepard of Norton, 7-0. In the championship, they lost to Erickson and Rothfuss of Colby, 7-1. Their season record is 10-7.

# Cowboys face Hoxie tonight on home field

The Cowboys face the Hoxie Indians at 6 p.m. Friday in the first game of the fall at Cowboys Stadium, and hope to turn things around with a win before the home crowd.

Coach Jonathan Dansel said he would like to see fans get to the field early to give the kids some support during warmups.

He said there will be fireworks planned when the team takes the field to help pump everyone up for the game.

Dansel said Wednesday the Cowboys had a good practice, one of the best. He said the Cowboys are excited about being able to finally play in front of their fans.

"I think this is a game we have a good shot at winning," he said. "We have been working on reading keys on offense and to take advantage of what they give us."

Dansel said Hoxie plays a lot of

formations, and the Cowboys have done a lot of work to do this week.

He said they have practiced pass blocking to try to give sophomore quarterback Travis Angelos a little more time.

Dansel said he has seen the tapes from the first two Hoxie games, and thinks they can match up with the Indians.

"Looking at the tape of our game in St. Francis, there were plays where if one of our guys would have done what he was assigned to, it would have been a different outcome," Dansel said. "I have been emphasizing to the boys that we can do a lot of good things if they do what there are assigned to do."

Hoxie has a 1-1 record, whipping Colby in the opening game, 26-15, then losing to Oberlin 33-12 last week.

Dansel said he thinks one of the top Hoxie players is injured, be-

cause there was a different quarterback in the Oberlin game. However, he said they won't know until the Indians take the field on Friday.

"We are trying to be as prepared as we can," Dansel said. "There were some improvements last week, and hopefully we have corrected some of our mistakes so we can move the ball."

Dansel said the defense is pretty solid, and he thinks the experience of the first two games will help the team against Hoxie.

"I know it is tough with players who have not had experience at some key positions," Dansel said, "but I think they are learning and coming together as a team."

Friday's game against Hoxie is the only time the Cowboys will be at home until the homecoming game on Oct. 6. The next two games are on the road at Scott City and Hays.

# Volleyball teams play in Denver tournaments

The Cowgirls varsity and junior varsity volleyball teams journeyed to Denver Saturday to play in tournaments.

The varsity team played in the Overland High School Volleyball Classic in Aurora, finishing 10 out of 12 teams.

Coach Jerry McKee said Faith Christian of Denver, out of the pool Goodland was in, won the tournament championship, beating Columbine High.

Goodland lost to Rampart of Colorado Springs, 25-14 and 25-17; Faith 25-15 and 25-18; Columbine 25-16 and 25-13; and Woodland Park, Colo., 25-19, 25-15 and 15-9. Goodland played Woodland Park for ninth place.

"We played well," McKee said, "but not well enough to beat that type of team. We were a bit sluggish at times. The speed of play was

faster than what we were used to.

"I hope the experience will help us. This is the first time we have been shut out at this tournament. We have been able to hold our own in the past, but it shows the improvement in the level of competition in the sport."

The 16 teams were divided into four pools, and the top team from each pool moved on to the championship round.

The four second-place teams then competed for the Division II crown with the third- and fourth-place teams battling for their respective titles.

Whitney Archer of Goodland was named to the all-tournament team by the vote of the opposing coaches.

The junior varsity team competed in a tournament at Bishop Machebeuf Catholic High School, com-

ing home with a similar record.

The girls lost to Fossil Ridge of Fort Collins, Colo., 25-6 and 25-21, Denver Lutheran 25-13 and 25-8, Classical Academy of Colorado Springs 25-17 and 25-7 and Summit High School of Frisco, Colo., 26-24, 25-20 and 15-6.

"The junior varsity played well at Machebeuf," McKee said.

"It was a good learning experience for us. We improved during the day."

On Tuesday, the teams went to a quad meet in Lakin. The varsity swept the meet, beating Scott City 25-20, 25-18 and 25-15; Leoti 25-13 and 25-18; and Lakin 25-22 and 25-22.

"Our attack ratio went up and passing showed improvement," McKee said.

The junior varsity beat Leoti and Lakin and lost to Scott City.
