Mustangs lose to Burlington

The Grant Junior High Mustangs lost football games in Atwood and Burlington in the past week, while the Lady Mustangs volleyball teams split matches in Atwood and in Hays.

Tuesday, the Mustangs football teams lost both games in Burlington. The seventh grade lost 22-6 and the eighth grade 34-0.

Last Thursday, the seventh grade lost 8-0 to Atwood in half a game,

and the eighth grade lost 14-6.

The Lady Mustangs split their matches in a quad meet on Tuesday at Felten Middle School in Hays.

The seventh grade lost all three matches. Against Kennedy Middle School they lost in the tiebreaker 23-25, 25-20, 15-3; against Felton 25-18, 25-18; and against Colby 25-19, 25-16.

The eighth grade won two of three matches. Against Kennedy

they were 25-14, 25-19, and against Felten 25-16, 25-14, but the team lost to Colby in the tiebreaker 25-21, 23-25, 15-13.

Last Thursday, the Lady Mustangs were in Atwood, where the seventh grade B team lost 26-24, 27-25, and the A team lost 25-5, 25-19.

The eighth-grade won 25-9, 25-22.

Golf team wins first at Russell

The Cowgirls won the Russell Golf Tournament on Monday, with their five golfers all in the top 11, and took second at the Colby Invitational.

Coach Connie Livengood took five golfers to Russell, while Activities Director Don Smith took five to compete in Colby. Both were varsity meets, the coach said.

Goodland was the top team at Russell with a score of 205, besting second-place Concordia's 207 and third-place Russell's 231. Bennington, Lamed and Hoisington placed fourth, fifth and sixth.

Sammie Raymer was third in individual scores with 48 strokes on the par-36 course. Chelsie Gausman was fifth with 50, Eryn Topliff ninth with 53, Brooke Whitmore 10th with 54 and Amber Douglas 11th after a tie-breaker with 54.

"I was very pleased with Amber," Livengood said, "as she had not ever seen the course before. I was also pleased with Chelsie finishing with a 50 and placing."

The Cowgirls took second at Colby with a team score of 259. Oakley was first with 255, Scott City third with 261, Syracuse fourth with 265 and Ulysses fifth with 278. Hays High School, Garden City and Colby did not have enough golfers for a team score.

Goodland's Natasha Hillman was third in individual scores with 53 on the par-38 course, and Kerri

The girls went to Scott City on Thursday and will compete in Ulysses at 9 a.m. Tuesday.

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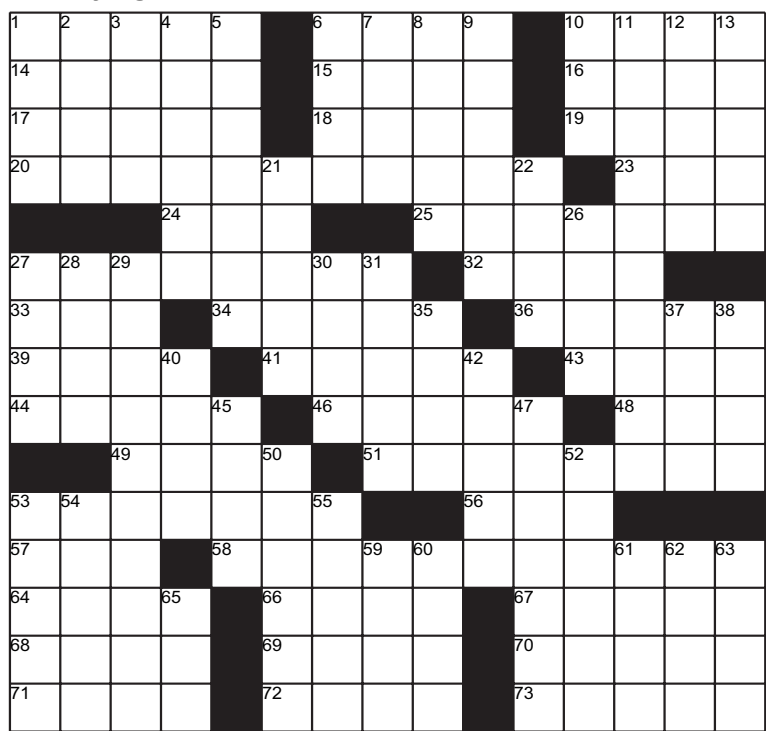
