# County commissioners review road and bridge budget figures

#### ROADS, from Page 1

The commissioners said the match for the Caldwell project had been brought up by Commissioner Chuck Thomas during a budget review on Thursday, Sept. 14, and that the commissioners had agreed the money should come out of the road and bridge budget. Way wasn't at the meeting.

The Caldwell project is being done through the Kansas Department of Transportation's five-year plan. The estimated cost was about \$400,000. The work includes milling off old asphalt and an overlay on the pavement, plus replacing the approaches to the Sappa Creek bridge with concrete.

Way told the commissioners at the budget review on Sept. 12, that the county cost would be 20 percent of the total, which he expected to be about \$78,000. There was no discussion from Way or the commissioners then about where the matching money could come from.

The bids for the Caldwell project came in lower, with Grasser Construction and Paving of Stratton the low bidder at \$347,063. The county was notified on Thursday, Aug. 31, that its share would be \$76,500.

bridge expenses for this year. County Clerk Janet Rumpel told the commissioners she looked at Way's estimated expenses, but did not see where it had been put in. She said the commissioners could take the money from the road and bridge budget. The commissioners agreed at that time the money should come out of road budget, and Commissioner Mitch Tiede said he would let Way know.

Tuesday Tiede said he didn't remember exactly what the commissioners had done, but that Rumpel had moved some money around.
