## Volleyball competes at Colby

The Goodland High School Cowgirls volleyball team played at a quad in Colby on Saturday. The team lost to Wheatland 25-19 and 25-23, beat Scott City 25-20 and 25-22 and lost to Colby 25-22 and 25-11. The Cowgirls won one volleyball match and lost two at the Holcomb Quad on Thursday.

In the first match, they defeated Dodge City 25-16 and 26-24. Senior Emily Murray scored 16 points, senior Lindsey Schields six, junior Andrey Wolak six, senior Amber Cowen eight, senior Shandel Simons seven and senior Nichole David seven. The Cowgirls lost the second match to Ulysses 25-18, 17-25 and

25-19. Murray scored eight points, Schields 11, Wolak 13, Cowen 10, Simons nine and David 11 points. In a close-fought final match, the Cowgirls went down to Holcomb 26-24 and 25-12. Murray scored 11, Schields 14, Wolak four, Cowen six, Simons four and David seven.

“We played well,” coach Jerry McKee. “Our matches were hard-fought battles.” The final quad for the Cowgirls volleyball team is at home today starting at 4:30 p.m. It will also be parents night for the seniors.

## Junior varsity tennis team second at home

The Cowgirl junior varsity tennis team took second place in their own Junior Varsity Invitational on Tuesday at the courts in Steever Park. In No. 1 singles, sophomore Shonna Webster won the gold with a 4-0 record. She beat Laura Dougherty of Colby, 6-0; Valerie Wagoner of Norton, 6-0; Debbie Kough of Scott City, 6-1; and Kelsie Bliss of WaKeeney, 6-0. “Shonna served and volleyed quite well and dominated her opponents,” said coach Wallace Hansen. In No. 2 singles, sophomore Kaitlin Fugleberg won with a 4-0

record. She beat Goodland sophomore Nicolette Wallis playing for Colby, 6-1; Tabitha Vincent of Norton, 6-1; Elizabeth Huck of Scott City, 6-1; and Nicole Griffin of WaKeeney, 6-0. “Kaitlin also played very well and dominated her opponents,” Hansen said. The No. 1 doubles team of sophomores Sandra Redlin and Linsey Owens won one and lost four. They beat Corbin and Nuzum of Norton 6-5 (8-6), and lost to Gasser and Newcomer of WaKeeney, 6-0;

Norman and Wessel of Scott City, 6-4; Campbell and Myers of Norton, 6-1; and Unruh and Rothfuss of Colby, 6-3. The No. 2 doubles team of sophomore Kathy Wood and foreign exchange student Leeanoora Kekalainen finished with a 3-2 record in a tie for second, third and fourth. By the tie breaking system, the girls got the fourth-place medal. They beat Tolle and Schroeder of Colby, 6-2; Fulton and Wicker of Norton, 6-5 (7-4); and Wilson and Yeager of Scott City, 6-2, losing to Opat and Nowlin of WaKeeney, 6-

2, and Myers and Fuller of Tribune, 6-4. “Kathy and Leeanoora kept the ball in play and played well in their matches,” Hansen said. Norton won the meet with 33 points, with Goodland coming in second with 29. Wakeeney took third with 24, Scott City and Tribune tied for fourth and fifth with 15 points and Colby came in sixth with six points. The next action for the junior varsity girls will be Saturday, Sept. 30, at Colby.

## Cowgirls golf finishes second

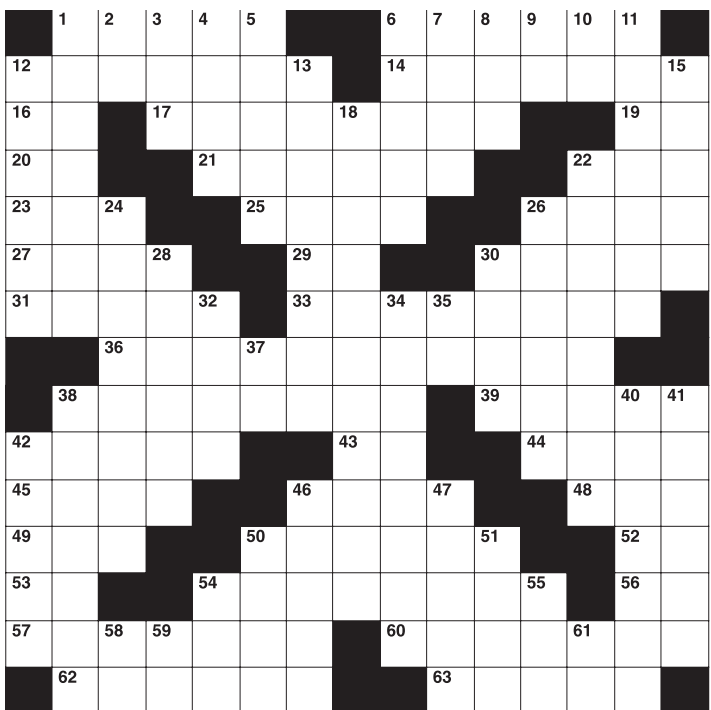

The Cowgirls varsity took first and 10th place medals and finished second as a team at a golf tournament in Scott City on Thursday. In junior varsity competition, Goodland golfers finished first and fourth. Senior Sammie Raymer was the top golfer in the tournament, finishing in 43 strokes on the par 36 course. Goodland senior Amber Webster finished 10th in 52. Sophomore Chelsie Gausman finished with a 56, senior Brooke Whitmore had 57, freshman Amber Douglas 60 and senior Kerri Bellamy 69. Their team score of 208 was second only to Syracuse with 191. Other teams were Holcomb with 218, Lakin with 244, Oakley with 249, Scott City with 250, Ulysses with 256 and Garden City with 269. Freshman Natashaia Hillman was first in junior varsity play with a 49, and junior Heidi Yonkey was fourth at 59. “I was very pleased with how the team played,” said Coach Connie Livengood. “The conditions were not fun to play in, but there were some very good scores turned in. “I am very pleased that Sammie Raymer scored well and won the tournament. This is the second year for her to win the Scott City tourney.

I am also very excited for Amber Webster to medal as an individual, a goal ... for her. She was very happy, and so was I. She has worked hard at practice.” Hillman put together a good tournament, the coach said; this is her second good outing, and she is back to back good performances. She will be playing with the varsity Tuesday at Ulysses, the coach said. Syracuse is going to be tough at the next three tournaments, Livengood said, and Goodland will see the Ulysses varsity on their home course and the rest of the season. Holcomb did not have all their girls there at Scott City, she said, but they will be exceptionally tough. “For our team,” Livengood said, “we will do well. The girls will have to play their best. Sometimes that is good enough to win, and sometimes it is not. It all comes down to who wants to win and can perform under pressure situations.” The girls know they have done well this year, she added; with any season there are ups and downs, but there are also some highlights that they will always remember. The team was in Ulysses today and will play at Lakin at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday. The junior varsity girls will play at 3 p.m. Thursday in Syracuse.
