

Kids Punt, Pass, Kick on cold Saturday morning

10, 11 boys
require
tiebreaker

About 20 kids braved the cold and wind Saturday to compete in the NFL Punt, Pass, Kick competition during the Flatlander Fall Festival.

A close race in the 10 and 11-year-old boy's division required a playoff. Tyler Gastineau and Ian Bonsall tied at 189 feet, and a tiebreaker was scheduled Thursday to determine which of them would take first and advance to sectional competition next month in Scott City.

First place in each division at sectional goes to a regional competition and the winners there go to the national event during the NFL playoffs.

Third place in the division went to Paylen Smith with 188 feet, 2 inches.

Kelby Smith was first in 8 and 9-year-old boys with 139 feet, 1 inch. Second was Josh David with 119 feet, 5 inches, and third was Gerell Miller with 115 feet, 3 inches.

Riley O'Harrah was first in 12- and 13-year-old boys with 310 feet, 9 inches. He has a good chance of advancing to the national competition, said Steve Jimenez, administrator of the Goodland Activities Center, which sponsors the event. His score Saturday would have earned him third place at the national contest last year, Jimenez said.

Second in 12 and 13-year-old boys was Dallas Delarosa with 257 feet, 1 inch, and third was Nick Thomas with 211 feet, 3 inches.

The only girl in the competition was Makayla Kennedy. She will
