Volleyball team wins at home

The Goodland High School varsity volleyball team put on a good show for Parent's Night on Tuesday in a quad meet at Max Jones Fieldhouse, winning all six of its games. Parents of the senior players were honored by the school and the mothers got a rose.

The varsity beat Golden Plains, 25-23 and 25-21; Dundy County (Benkelman), Neb., 25-22 and 25-15; and Weskan, 25-16 and 25-16. In the second game against Dundy County, senior Whitney Archer put her spiking skills to good use, said coach Jerry McKee.

Dundy County beat Golden Plains, 25-18 and 25-19 and Weskan 25-18 and 25-15. Weskan beat Golden Plains 25-19 and 25-15.

The junior varsity had a tougher row to hoe. They beat Golden Plains, 25-19 and 25-10; but lost to Dundy County, 25-22, 17-25 and 15-11, and to Weskan, 25-12, 23-25 and 15-8.

The junior varsity in its second game with Weskan played almost point for point, finally winning. In the first and third games when Weskan established a lead, though, they just kept going.

In the junior varsity competition, Weskan beat Golden Plains, 25-14 and 25-11, and Dundy County beat Golden Plains, 25-14 and 25-20.

In C team action, Goodland lost to Weskan, 25-19 and 25-16; Dundy County, 25-18 and 25-17; and the Dundy County junior varsity, 25-20 and 25-17.

Dundy County beat Weskan, 25-21 and 25-22. Golden Plains did not field a C team.

Tennis team fifth

The Cowgirls varsity tennis team finished fifth with 28 points in a 12-team tournament in Garden City on Saturday.

"The girls did well," said Coach Wallace Hansen, noting that they faced two Class 6A teams, Dodge City and Garden City; three 5-A teams, Hays, Liberal and Great Bend; plus Class 4A Colby, Ulysses, an extra team from Garden City and Perryton, Texas.

In No. 1 singles, senior Jillian Parker placed fifth. She beat Vanessa Rodriguez of Garden City, 8-1, and Holly Plunk of Liberal, 8-4. She lost to Kristen Doering of Garden City, 8-5, and Kelly Smidt of

Cimarron, 8-3. Parker's season record is 17-8.

Seniors Jena McCall and Sandy Johnson in No. 1 doubles won fourth place. They beat Baez and Strickland of Garden City, 8-3, and Kreie and Bracheisen of Ulysses, 8-1. They lost to Larson and Hall of Dodge City, 8-3, and Wilson and Dugger of Colby, 8-6. McCall and Johnson's record is 20-5 for the season.

"The Dodge City pair were the best team McCall and Johnson have faced this year," Hansen said.

Sophomore Kathy Wood in No. 2 singles went 0-3. She lost to Brit-tany Hillman of Perryton, 8-5; Kerri

Lash of Liberal, 8-0; and Aimee Brandt of Garden City Brown, 8-4. Wood faced stiff competition, Hansen said.

In No. 2 doubles, sophomores Kaitlin Fugleberg and Shonna Webster finished fifth with a 3-2 record. They beat Paige Russell and Caitlin Walz of Garden City Brown, 8-2; Aimee Deal and Ali Kemp of Perryton, 8-4; and Alana Settle and Jen Pfannenstiel of Hays 8-6. They lost to Emma Kennedy and Jessie McNutt of Garden City White, 8-2, and a close match to Erickson and Rothfuss of Colby, 8-7. Their record is 16-10.

Cowgirls finish second

The Cowgirls tennis team finished second among seven teams Tuesday at the Colby Varsity Invitational.

In No. 1 singles, senior Jillian Parker won the silver medal with a 3-1 record, her only loss to Logan Wark of Colby. Parker beat Irvin of Garden City, 7-2, Nelson of Norton, 7-4, and had a default over Tribune, 7-0.

"Entering next week's regional competition, Jillian has a season record of 19-10," said Coach Wallace Hansen. "Four of the losses were to Wark of Colby and two losses to Kelly Smidt of Cimarron. All three qualified for state last year."

In No. 2 doubles, seniors Jena McCall and Sandy Johnson won the gold medal with a 4-0 record. They beat Weber and Prince of Garden

City, 7-1; Mills and Volgamore of Norton, 7-2; Wineinger and Schmidt of Tribune, 7-2; and for the championship, Dugger and Wilson of Colby, 7-4. Their season record is 24-5.

"They have avenged four of their five losses," Hansen said, "and they head into regionals with an excellent chance of a top-four seeding, which gives them a good chance of qualifying for state."

"They finished fifth at regionals last year and only need to improve one place to qualify for state."

State competition will be at Emporia on Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 14 and 15, Hansen said.

Sophomore Sandra Redlin continued to improve in No. 2 singles, finishing in seventh place, 1-3. She lost to Walz of Garden City, Brooks of Norton and Fuller of Tribune.

Her win was from a default.

"Saundra has done well for her first year of competitive tennis," Hansen said.

In No. 2 doubles, sophomores Kaitlin Fugleberg and Shonna Webster finished fourth, 2-2. They beat Saucedo and McNeil of Garden City, 7-1, and Crittendon and Moritz of Tribune, 7-1. They lost to Jones and Marx of Norton, 7-5, and Erickson and Rothfuss of Colby, 7-3. They are 18-12 for the season.

"They won't get a seed at regionals but are in a position to pull an upset," Hansen said.

The coach said the team will be competing at the Pratt Regional on Thursday, facing teams from Butler, Colby, Kingman, Larned, Nickerson, Pratt, Russell and Ulysses.

Cowboys face tough Hays team

The Cowboys are on the road again tonight to face Hays High, with the kickoff at 6:30 p.m. Mountain Time.

This will be the fourth road game for the team, now 1-3. The Cowboys fought hard last Friday, but fell to the Scott City Beavers, 47-20.

Hays High played Garden City in the Western Athletic Conference on the road, posting a 29-26 win.

Cowboy Coach Jonathan Dancel said the Hays Indians are similar to Scott City.

"Hays has a good quarterback like Scott City," Dancel said, "and they have good players at the skill positions."

"We have got to work on pass coverage. This week, we gave up a couple of big plays against Scott City."

Hays senior quarterback Kameron Parker threw 32 passes and completed 21 against Garden City for 345 yards.

The Indians are 2-2 for the season, and the win over Garden City was their second straight.

Dancel said his team is mostly healthy and the boys had good practices this week. He said after the Scott City game, the team would try to take more advantage of the option running of sophomore quarterback Travis Angelos. They know the defense will have to get some pressure on the Indians' quarterback, he said.
