At Hays, the teams traded turnovers in the first half. The Cowboys had six on three fumbles, two interceptions and one take away that was ruled a fumble.

After Bob Doxon recovered a fumble at the Goodland 39, it looked like the Cowboys were going. On third down, sophomore quarterback Travis Angelos passed to sophomore tight end Brandon Rome deep in Indian territory. Rome was running toward the end zone when Hays quarterback Kameron Parker, playing safety on defense, caught him at the Indian 13 and took the ball away, returning it to the Indian 23.

The Indians had three turnovers with two fumbles in the first quarter, and Forest Trachsel intercepted an Indian pass to stop a scoring threat early in the second period.

After stopping the Indians at the beginning of the second - down 7-0 — the Cowboys made mistakes that cost them 35 points as the Indians took five turnovers and turned them into quick touchdowns to lead 42-0 at half.

With 34 second left in the second over on downs to finish the third quarter, the Cowboys got moving from their 35, but Angelos' pass to senior tight end Tyler Hillmer was out of bounds in the end zone.
