Cowboys score 30 but lose to Hays High

Team to face Oakley

The Cowboys will be looking to carry the momentum of a strong second half Friday to get a faster start against the Oakley Plainsmen, who invade Cowboys Stadium at 6 p.m. Friday for Goodland's homecoming.

The Cowboys are 1-4 for the season while the No. 3 state-ranked Plainsmen come in with a 4-0 record after beating Colby 28-6.

Homecoming activities will

begin at 6:30 p.m. Thursday with a parade down Main, winding its way to Cowboys Stadium for a pep rally and bonfire with the team, the Jumpin' Juniors, the cheerleaders and marching band.

Though there are only four seniors on the football team, parents with the help of some senior students have prepared a special Dukes of Hazard skit for the pep rally on Thursday.

and seventh turnover came less than a minute later, and it took one play for the Indians to score, making it 58-0 with 8:30 left in the quarter.

Hays put in some second string defenders and the Cowboys took advantage, scoring four touchdowns and making three of four two-point conversions for 30 unanswered points.

The first touchdown was on a 31-yard pass from Angelos to junior wide receiver Josh Doke.

It capped a 75-yard drive featuring five plays and two penalties. Angelos ran for the conversion.

The teams each turned the ball over on downs to finish the third quarter.

Junior running back Casey Henderson broke through the middle on the first play of the fourth quarter for a 59-yard touchdown, then ran for a two-point conversion to make it 58-16.

Henderson scored again on the next Cowboys' drive, which went 67 yards in seven plays and one penalty. Henderson scored from the 5. The two-point conversion attempt was no good, making it 58-22.

On their next drive, the Cowboys went 80 yards in six plays with Henderson getting his third touchdown on a 1-yard run.

Henderson carried the ball five times on that drive and Hawkins ran for 11 yards.

After breaking a tackle he fumbled the ball, but it bounced back into his hand and he gained 5 more yards to the Indians' 27. Franando Martinez ran for the two-point conversion to make it 58-30.

Henderson carried the ball 29 times for 229 yards and three touchdowns, catching one pass for 17 yards.

Hawkins carried five times for 32 yards, and Angelos seven times for 32.

Hillmer had two receptions for 11 yards, Doke had one for 31 yards and a touchdown and Trachsel had one for 6 yards, plus an interception on defense.

Standouts on defense were Josiah Goodley, Jace Mosbarger, Andrew Taylor, Doxon, A.J. Stephens and Aaron Deeds. John Mosbarger was hurt, apparently an injury to one of his hands.
