

Cowboys face Oakley for Homecoming

The unbeaten Oakley Plainsmen — ranked third in the state Class 2-1A — invade Cowboys Stadium at 6 p.m. tonight for homecoming.

The Plainsmen (5-0) are coming off a 28-6 win over the Colby Eagles, and the Plainsmen defeated the fourth-ranked Class 2-1A St. Francis Indians 20-16 the week before in a battle of unbeaten teams.

Cowboys Coach Jonathan Dansel said the Plainsmen like to play power football, and use the wishbone and the power I.

“They have big strong kids in the backfield,” Dansel said. “They like to run the ball, and have good athletes at the skill positions.

“We have to refocus our goals for this season and come out and try to put four quarters together.”

The Cowboys (1-4) are coming off a disappointing 58-30 game against Hays High, and Coach Dansel said the score did not reflect

how bad the game really was.

“We were about to tie it up in the second quarter,” Dansel said, “and the to walk into the locker room 42-0. It was a disappointment quarter with a lack of focus and emotion. We hope to get that turned around.”

Hays High was leading 7-0 when the Cowboys began to drive down the field, and sophomore Travis Angelos threw a pass to sophomore Brandon Rome and it appeared he was free going to make it to the end zone when the Hays quarterback Kameron Parker caught him at the Indian 13 and took the ball away, returning it to the Indian 23.

Dansel said he couldn’t believe the turnaround in that play, and the effect on the team’s play.

“I knew we were in trouble when we recovered a fumble at the our 12-yard line and none of the team was excited,” Dansel said. “The score was actually 58-7 against the top

team. We play with zero intensity and no emotion.

“Emotion is an important part of keeping your focus in the game and on what you are doing.

“We have got to use this game to get ready for district play. We know that is going to be tough.”

Dansel said John Mosbarger injured his elbow in the Hays game and will not play tonight. As to any other injuries Dansel said Ryan Gausman’s knee is bothering him, but that Clay Schilling was back for the Hays game.

“Schilling was not 100 percent,” Dansel said, “but he played at Hays and will play against Oakley.”

The Cowboys will begin district play next Friday when the fourth-ranked Class 4A Ulysses Tigers (4-1) come to Cowboys Stadium. The Tiger’s loss was to the fourth-ranked Class 3A Scott City Beavers (5-0).

Goodland graduate leads conference in punting

The Garden City Community College football team won its fourth game of the season last Saturday defeating the Scotties of Highland Community College 21-17.

The Broncbusters entered the game with a 3-1 record with their only loss coming on Sept. 2 against Butler County, then ranked No. 2 in the nation, 29-7.

Goodland’s contribution to Garden City’s success is sophomore defensive back Derrick Raymer, who also does the punting and the kicking for the ’Busters. Six weeks into the season, Raymer leads the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference in punting averag-

ing more than 40 yards per boot.

He is fourth among the conference’s kickers in scoring with 19 points on 16 extra-point kicks and a field goal.

Raymer has 39 tackles, 26 unassisted, and two interceptions .

A 2005 graduate of Goodland High, he is the son of Steve and Debra Raymer of Goodland, where his dad is junior high principal.

In his senior year as a Cowboy, Derrick made first-team All-Northwest Kansas League as a quarterback and punter.

He was a second-team pick as a linebacker and kicker that same season.

Goodland opened its season on Aug. 26 with a 21-17 win over Trinity Valley Community College in Texas.

A week after their loss to Butler County, the Broncbusters defeated Dodge City Community College 31-7. They won their home opener on Sept. 23 by beating Hutchinson Community College 35-9.

Goodland moved up one spot to No. 13 in this week’s poll by the National Junior College Athletic Association. Butler County, which is now 5-0, is the poll’s No. 1 team with Coffeyville Community College at 4-1 ranked No. 9.

Kansas Wesleyan Coyotes beat Ottawa Braves, 42-19

The Coyotes of Kansas Wesleyan University beat the Braves of Ottawa University 42-19 last Saturday to improve their record to 4-0 for the season.

Fans in Ottawa watched the Coyotes score the game’s first 14 points then take a 21-3 lead into the locker room at halftime.

Although the Braves did a better job of scoring in the second half, Kansas Wesleyan still dominated, outscoring the home team 14-10 in

the third quarter and 7-6 in the fourth. Ottawa fell to 0-4 for the season..

The Coyotes play Southwestern College at Martin Stadium in Salina on Saturday for the first of three straight home games.

The Moundbuilders also are 0-4 after losing 28-24 to Haskell Indian Nations University last weekend in Lawrence.

Cowgirls defeat Brewster

At the Rawlins County Quad on Tuesday the Goodland High School varsity volleyball team lost to Rawlins County 24-26 and 20-25 and Oberlin 25-10 and 25-12 but defeated Brewster 25-22, 16-25 and 25-19.

In the match with Brewster Whitney Archer led the scoring with 15 points and six aces, Nicolette Clancy 13 points and one ace, Shandel Simon nine points and one ace, Emily Murray eight points, Kaylee Billinger six points, Nicole David four points and Lindsey Schields 10 points.

“We were able to shut down the Brewster offense with our blocking,” Coach Jerry McKee said.

Ashley Christenson, Murray, Archer, Billinger and Clancy each got blocks.

“A nine point run on offense by Archer in the third game was the turning point in the match,” Coach McKee said. “We were able to find a soft spot in Brewster’s serve receive and attacked it forcing them out of system or scored with an ace serve.”

In the Rawlins County match Clancy led the scoring with 10 points and two aces. Archer scored seven points and one ace, Murray eight points and one ace, Billinger six points and one ace, Schields eight points and Amber Cowan three points and one ace.

“In our match against Oberlin we played sluggish and were unable to get the ball down on their defense. They did not allow us to have any runs with

our offense,” Coach McKee said. “We allowed them two big runs in each of the games.”

Going into the quad Brewster was undefeated, 18-0, and was ranked third in 1A, Oberlin was undefeated, 18-0, and ranked first in 3A.

The junior varsity won one and lost two. The C team lost to Rawlins County, 25-18 and 25-22 and Oberlin 25-12 and 25-12.

In the C team quad on Monday the Goodland team went 2-1. Goodland beat Wallace County 26-24, 11-25 and 15-10; Weskan 25-20 and 25-19; and lost to Colby 25-15 and 25-9.

The Goodland High School varsity volleyball team lost all four of its matches at the Oakley Tournament on Saturday.

The girls lost to Wheatland, 21-25, 25-21 and 25-20; Colby 25-17 and 25-21; Oakley, 25-20 and 25-12; and Oakley, 25-20 and 26-24.

The junior varsity beat Oakley in two matches, but lost to Colby and Wheatland.

Saturday, the junior varsity and C teams will play at Hays in a tournament with teams from Hays, Dodge City, Garden City, Otis Bison, Salina South, Smith Center and Russell. Goodland starts play around 11 a.m. Pool play will be followed by tournament play for the top two finishers in each division. Tuesday, the varsity, junior varsity and C volleyball teams will play at Oakley. On Thursday, the C team will play at Colby.
