The girls had the seventh and 10th-place runners at Oberlin but didn't have enough for a team score. Cowgirls Whitney Dautel, Stephanie Sheldon and Cassie Cooper also ran at Stanton County High School in Johnson.

Kerek Mason finished fourth at Johnson in 18 minutes, 20.17 seconds, but didn't run in Oberlin because of mononucleosis.

"He will be out awhile," said Coach Richard Schwasinger. "We are crossing our fingers whether he will even run at league."

The team has had a string of flu, the coach said, but the kids are getting better, except for Mason.

"We just thought Kerek had the flu," Schwasinger said. "It was a one-day flu for most but really got them down. But Kerek didn't get better, so he went to the doctor again."

Mason may be back for the Northwest Kansas League meet Saturday, Oct. 14, at Oakley, the coach said, but he may not be in great shape. Hopefully by regionals the following Saturday, he will be OK, Schwasinger said; that would give him time to get ready for state. Goodland will compete without Mason at 9 a.m. Saturday at Lakin.

Mason is unhappy about missing part of the season, the coach said; the last two to three weeks he's had problems mustering enough energy to get through the races. This may explain why he hasn't been winning, Schwasinger said; in the last few meets he hasn't been aggressive.
