through the state Department of Commerce, estimated the net benefit to the city at \$1.25 in income for every \$1 in tax abatement over 10 years. He said the benefit is higher for the county, with \$8.90 in income for every \$1 in abatement. The Goodland School District would see \$1.11 for every \$1 in abatement. The study estimates the payback time at eight years for the city and nine years for the school district. He said that is when the amount of benefit received by the city and school district would equal the amount of taxes abated.
Froggatte said he had gathered the figures and sent them to the

state, and agency had turned the analysis around in two days.
"I think they are supportive of the other projects going on in the county," Froggatte said, adding that the developers expect to spend about \$4.5 million and create 20 new jobs.
"The economic development pays for itself," Froggatte said. Billinger noted that the property is not bringing in much as is, just the taxes on the land.
Irvin told the city commission Froggatte will be coming back to help complete the bond issue, and that Gilmore and Bell had been hired to do the legal work.
