

Insurance costs rising for Sherman community carnival

handle that kind of policy.

“We all face problems with insurance costs,” Rasure said, “and it is not going to get easier.”

Schiels said the storage building could be put up in about 10 weeks. He said they might get the concrete and plumbing in this fall, but if the weather turns cold, the building would be finished in the spring.

“If we get five feet of snow, we will be glad with that,” he said. “We have spent quite a bit of money on the horses and other rides, and it will be nice to have a place to keep them secure.”

“We are spending about \$11,500 on repairs for the rides this year. That is just the parts.”

Schiels said the carnival did better this year than last, partly because ticket prices were higher. He said

the insurance cost went up \$3,000 this year.

“With our budget, we hope to survive until next year,” Schiels said. “We hope our expenses will be similar to this year.”

Schiels said the new rides went over well. He said it helped that the smaller blow-up slide for the kids was donated. He said the slide the carnival bought went over well, too.

The fishing pond put on by Greg

Williams of Just Ponds and More and sponsored by Bankwest went great, he said. He said all the proceeds went to the carnival.

“This is another part of the community stepping forward and making things happen,” Schiels said.

He said the carnival set up a special account through the Sherman County Community Foundation to accept donations, and hopes they

can get some money to help with tools and parts to repair the rides.

“We have had someone come to the foundation,” he said, “and they can designate where the money is to be spent for repairs or new rides.”

Schiels said the carnival paid money out to 30 groups that helped during the fair. He said the groups deserved their share of the proceeds for their effort.

“We think we will be all right,” Schiels said, “but right now our budget is negative after paying out to all the groups who helped.”

Schiels said the wristband night was the biggest night the carnival has had.

“It was an excellent idea, and when we did it on Friday, it was the second biggest night we have had,” he said.

County to build storage building

Schiels said Sunday the new building would include restrooms on the north end along with a prize booth for carnival games.

He said the building would be mostly for storage, but there would be a section on the south for a workshop.

The carnival board has been working on the storage building for about three years. Harlan House, who was on the carnival board when it was organized about 10 years ago, helped get a \$125,000 tax credit grant to buy the land in 2003.

Schiels said the carnival group was able to sell about \$84,000 of the

tax credits, which allowed them to pay for the land, and there is about \$27,000 to help pay for the building.

Dennis Malsom of Malsom Welding and Repair will build the building at a cost of \$115,000 without the utilities, Schiels said. Volunteer work will help keep the cost down.

Schiels said he and Tiede had been out to the site and staked out the building and looked at the two openings for traffic.

Rasure said the project is a win-win for everyone, and will help the carnival group get a place to store its rides.

Presently, the rides are being

stored in the main agriculture building and a couple of the animal buildings, he said, and this will allow for other events to use the buildings.

Rasure said the money for the building would come out of the capital reserve fund the commissioners established a couple of years ago for county building projects.

Schiels said having a storage building would be good for securing the rides and getting them in good shape. He said a door between the workshop and storage area will make it possible to work on ride parts without having to take them outside, especially in winter.
