A few days later I received a card in the mail from Mildred Cornelius of Thayer, Mo. "Your mother may have told you that I called her to inquire about you. I wanted to tell you how much I enjoyed your book about the Fleagle Gang. My family moved to Lamar the day of the robbery so don't remember much about it. I looked on Google and found your book and bought it. It inspired me to write a journal to pass on to

my children about growing up in southeast Colorado. My maiden name was Keeton and I was four years ahead of your dad in school.
