Republican Congressman Jerry Moran easily won re-election, getting 83 percent (1,563) in Sherman County and 79 percent (153,298) across the 69 counties of the 1st District. Democrat John Doll had 16 percent (305) in Sherman County and 20 percent (33,320) in the dis-
