**Luis Ledesma Cupcakes**  
1 cup flour  
11 cups chocolate  
2 eggs  
First, mix the chocolate and the crack the eggs. Put the cupcakes in the oven. Bake at 50 degrees for a couple hours. Serves 50 people.

**Katie Purvis Mashed Potatoes**  
4 cups salt and pepper  
1 cup butter

6 cups gravy  
First, mix the milk and stir in the gravy. Then melt the butter and flour with the gravy. Mix in the salt and pepper. Bake at 20 degrees for 20 minutes. Serves 19 people.

**Gavin Linnell Ham**  
1 cup meat  
1 tablespoon water  
2 eggs  
2 teaspoon sugar  
1 tablespoon flour  
8 tablespoon cinnamon

First, mix the sugar in the meat and add the eggs and cinnamon. Bake at 7 degrees for 10 minutes. Serves 7 people.

**Devinee Borgmann Brownies**  
2 cups water  
3 eggs  
1 cup milk  
1 cup flour  
1 cup oil  
1 cup salt  
First, mix the water and eggs. Stir in flour. Next pour in oil. Bake at 12

degrees for a couple of hours. Serves 10 people.

**Cade McLean Spinach**  
3 cups salt  
1 cup sugar  
2 eggs  
1 cup flour  
2 oranges  
spinach  
First, mix the sugar, salt, and spinach. Stir in the flour and eggs and 2 oranges. Bake at 3 degrees for 3 hours. Serves 21 people.

**Saje Miller Cherry Salad**  
5 cups sugar  
10 cherries  
1 teaspoon. water  
1 cup flour  
First, mix the sugar, flour and water. Drop in the 10 cherries. Bake at 3 degrees for 10 minutes. Serves 10 people.

**Ivan Diaz Strawberry Pie**  
3 teaspoons chocolate  
1 tablespoon salt  
3 cups strawberries  
5 cups juice

2 cups meat  
5 cups flour  
First, mix the flour with the juice. Then put the meat in. Pour strawberries also. At last, put the chocolate and salt in. Bake at 400 degrees for days. Serves 40 people.

**Elena Flores Pudding**  
1 cup pink milk  
2 pieces of chocolate cake  
2 cups sugar  
4 candy bars  
First, mix the milk and sugar. Mom makes the cake and we eat it

"The parade will start at 17th and Main and go to Eighth and Main," said organizer Debbie Reed of Hayden Inc. "Santa will circle around to go to the Chamber office."

The jolly old gentleman will be hearing what kids want for Christmas from 2 to 4 p.m. at the Chamber of Commerce office in the Centennial building, 104 E. 10th. Santa

will also give out candy. The candy was donated by Reed.

The Kiwanis Club and the local motorcycle riders will be in the parade and will collect toys and donations for the Toys for Tots. The toys later will be given out with food baskets from Genesis Food Bank.

The 170th Maintenance Unit of the Kansas National Guard will help collect the toys. Kiwanis president Brad Schields said he expects 25 bikes for the parade and if the weather is nice, the number could be closer to 80.

From 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., the motorcycle club will pass out vouch-

served foreign food to 400 people and had dancing and activities from foreign cultures.

The first student came to Goodland in 1971, she said, a young man from Switzerland who stayed with Clark and Pat Jordan. The teacher who helped start it, Porterfield said, married and went to Peru before the student got here, so she didn't get to enjoy the results.

For her, Porterfield said, AFS has meant friends all around the world, four trips to Paraguay and one to Spain, even serving as host for the president of Paraguay when he visited Kansas.

She helped bring the first exchange to the United States from Paraguay after the dictator there left office and eventually she became the president of Kansas/Paraguay

During that time, she said, the first elected Paraguayan president visited Kansas. As president of the partners group, Porterfield had planned an event in Topeka that included a dinner for him and giving a speech in Spanish and English with the president in the audience.

"I tell my students it doesn't matter where you come from," she said. "If you get involved with something, there are rewards for working at something you love. When you have an opportunity, don't be afraid to say, 'I'll help.'"

"Who would have thought a farm girl from Ransom would host a president?"

Porterfield and her husband Cliff have been the host family for five students for whole years, she said, and several for shorter times, a week to three months. They have kept in touch with them all and have been to weddings for two, an exchange daughter from Barbados

who moved to Virginia who Mr. Porterfield walked down the aisle, and an exchange son from the Dominican Republic.

The parents of two others, a boy from Argentina and a boy from Japan, have come to visit the Porterfields.

She has traveled to Paraguay four times and went to Spain once, as a chaperone on an AFS flight with 35 students from the United States.

"I have friends all over the globe," Porterfield said. "My dream would be to do a tour of the world and visit all the AFS kids we've had here."

"Unless we find an oil well in our yard," she added, "I don't think that's going to happen."

But Porterfield said she feels fortunate to get to know so many people and have had the experiences she's had. When serving as chaperone for the flight, Porterfield said, she had the choice to go to Spain or to Italy.

"It was for sure Spain," she said.

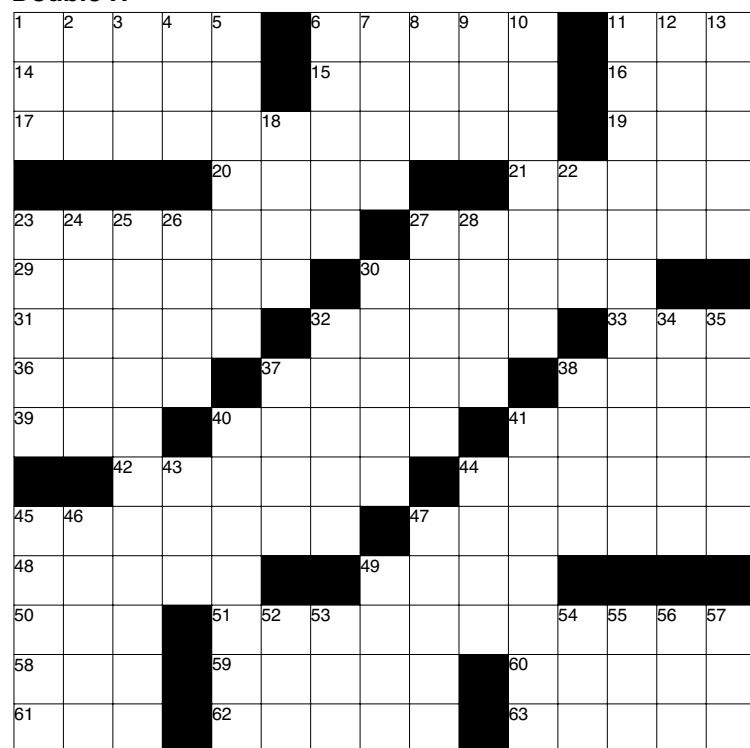
