



Hoxie match first test for new wrestling coach

The Hoxie Indians bring a strong wrestling tradition to the Cowboys' opening match at 5:30 p.m. Thursday at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The Cowboys will wrestle for the first time under head coach Joe Sramek, who was an assistant for Coach Randy Bahe last year.

The Cowboys finished second at the Class 4A regional tournament in Russell last season and were 10th in the state tournament. Hoxie finished sixth in the 3-2-1A state wrestling tournament.

Returning wrestlers are seniors Bob Doxon, Brett Schields and Kerek Mason; juniors A.J. Stephens, Michael Ledesma, Aaron Deeds, Ren Scherling and T.J. Hawkins; and sophomores Vance Johnson, Fernando Martinez, Josh Lamb, Ryan Taylor, Keegan Smith, T.J. Freeman, Tanner Oharah, and Kade Sheldon. Freshmen on this year's team include Jay Cotter, Paul Starr, Zac Prine, and Lorenzo Delgado. Sramek grew up in Atwood and teaches math besides being head wrestling coach this fall.

Ex-Cowgirl basketball player scores 29 points in shootout

Goodland native Jayci Stone scored 29 points as the University of Alaska Anchorage women's basketball team won the Carrs/Safeway Great Alaska Shootout last week, improving its record to 4-0.

The Seawolves, the host team, defeated the Air Force Academy 62-60 last Tuesday and the University of California, Riverside the next day 72-67.

Alaska-Anchorage is an NCAA Division II team while both Air Force and Riverside are Division I schools.

Stone scored 21 points to lead Anchorage against Air Force. She hit three of six three-point shots and was a perfect eight for eight at the free-throw line. Stone was second on the team in rebounds with 10.

Against Riverside, Stone scored eight points and grabbed seven rebounds. She leads the team in scoring with 59 points and is second in rebounds with 30.

The Seawolves will be back in

action on Friday and Saturday for the Glacier Classic in Fairbanks, about 360 miles north of Anchorage.

They will face Fort Lewis State College of Durango, Colo., the first day, then take on Brigham Young University-Hawaii the next.

Anchorage was picked to finish fifth among the nine teams of the Great Northwest Athletic Conference in the coaches' preseason poll.

The Seawolves open conference play on Jan. 3 against the visiting Nanooks of the University of Alaska Fairbanks.
