Goodland had the most undefeated wrestlers, followed by Norton and Garden City, who each had four. Goodland lost to Garden City in the dual to determine first and third places. Norton was second.

The rest of the 12 teams in order were Oakley, Scott City, Buhler, Pratt, Dodge City, Ulysses, Hugoton, Quinter and Wichita County.

The Cowboys have five wrestlers ranked statewide by the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association.

The Cowboys' five state-ranked wrestlers are Stephens ranked sixth at 140, Schields ranked third at 171, Goodley second at 189, Hawkins fifth at 215 and Bob Doxon fourth at 275.

In Pool A at the Holiday Classic, Goodland beat Dodge City, Hugoton and Scott City and then lost to Norton in the dual for first or third.

"It was a very successful tournament with a lot of great competition," said Coach Joseph Sramek. "I felt all the Goodland wrestlers gave a great effort. In a Dual, it is really when the other teams have a full
